Without that Gospel message, there is no reason for us to even exist.

God has certainly been with Trinity Lutheran Church over the years. As we look back over 128 years of history, we can plainly see that. Our completed narthex is not just a testimony to the efforts of those who volunteered their time, talent, and treasures; it is a testament to God's work among us!

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness,¹⁷ so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV)

These verses from 2 Timothy chapter 3 come from a section called All Scripture is Breathed Out by God (ESV). In this section, Paul gives his final charge to young Timothy, pointing to himself as an example of a Godly man, a man who firmly believed in the Gospel and dedicated his entire life to spreading the good news. Paul lovingly mentored Timothy from childhood and taught him to hold to the holy scriptures which reveal the basic teachings about Jesus that are fundamentally true. Paul wrote this letter from a Roman prison cell to emphasize the importance of faithfully teaching the Word in opposition to false teachers and to give final encouragement to young Timothy, pastor of the church of Ephesus. In 2 Timothy, the Lord is calling you to cling faithfully to His inspired Word. The Word of God is truth and the truth never changes. However, in today's postmodern world, people are the final reference points for truth. Truth in this sense is relative. This essentially leads to the belief that what you believe to be right and what I believe to be right can both be right. Therefore, two mutually opposed systems may be right. However, truth needs to correspond to reality. Reality, not our preferences, needs to be the ultimate source and authority for truth. Relativism robs all of our arguments for Christianity of any significance. It makes the defense of supposed truth meaningless.

Dear friends in Christ, we must guard ourselves from moral relativism and instead embrace the inspired Word of God as the ultimate authority. Scripture is relevant in all ages and at all times (1 John 2:12-14). We see in 2 Timothy 3:16-17 that scripture is God-breathed. God-breathed literally means that God breathed life into all things, including the Word of God. God breathed life into

all things and sustains and governs all things. Therefore scripture is completely trustworthy because God was in control of its writing, not humans. It is not a human book. It's words are entirely authoritative for our faith and life. We see and know that the Bible is not a collection of stories, fables, myths, or merely human ideas about God. The whole Bible is God's inspired word. Reading scripture as the inspired, inherent Word of God has eternal implications. As broken people living in a sinful world, we sometimes lose sight of what's true. We look to science and reason to give us all of life's answers instead of turning to God....even when the scriptures are right there in front of us! What we always need to keep in perspective above all things is that God's Word is our standard for testing everything else that claims to be true. It is our safeguard against false teachings and our source of guidance for how we should live. Western society, pop-culture, and moral relativism fool us into thinking that we define our own truth. These influences pull us in the opposite direction of God and have the potential to mislead us into thinking that we don't need God's Word as long as we are living what we deem to be a righteous life. You are not your own authority on truth, especially in regards to spiritual matters. God alone and His Word alone are our only source of guidance. Applying God's Word to your everyday life leads to a life of blessing and fulfillment because you are no longer living for yourself, you are seeking to align your will with God's. Without God's scripture, I would be utterly blind, aimlessly wandering through life chasing after and longing for something more. God's Word is relevant. It is true. God desires for you to seek Him out and have a relationship with Him. Read God's Word, refer to it in all things, and use its teachings to guide your conduct daily.
