Holy Week

While the world often gives little notice to it, Holy Week is the most significant week in the Church Year. These are the services, after all, that focus on the suffering and death of Jesus Christ our Savior, without whom we would be lost forever. This week prepares us for the joy that we express as we celebrate the Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

With this being such a significant week, the services on Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion, Maundy (or Holy) Thursday, and Good Friday are unique. They have many of the elements we are used to seeing in every service at church, such as confession and absolution, preaching of God's Word, and the celebration of the Lord's Supper, but there are also lots of other interesting things going on in these services. I thought I'd take this opportunity to describe some of these unique elements and explain the significance of each one.

The first service of Holy Week is Palm Sunday/Sunday of the Passion. This service really covers the entire last week of Jesus' life. The service begins at the back of the sanctuary with the reading of the Palm Sunday Gospel. This is done from the back of the sanctuary with the processional cross leading the way so that we can process into the chancel with palms (the area where the altar is) just as Jesus processed into Jerusalem to waving palms on the first Palm Sunday. We sing the hymn "All Glory, Laud and Honor" as the procession moves forward. As we move through the scripture readings, the tone changes from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to his trial, suffering and death. The Gospel for The Sunday of the Passion consists of two full chapters of Mark. This Sunday truly highlights the conflicting emotions of Holy Week. Jesus is indeed the King who comes to bring salvation to the world. But the way that that salvation is accomplished is filled with pain and agony. Maundy Thursday is the second Holy Week service. "Maundy" comes from the Latin word *mandatum* which means "command." Jesus gives his disciples a new command (*mandatum*) that they love one another as he has loved them in John 13:34, part of the Gospel reading for Maundy Thursday. Maundy (some call it Holy) Thursday focuses primarily on that meal and what happened afterwards in the Garden of Gethsemane. It was at the Last Supper that Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper, giving his disciples his body and blood to eat and to drink. We eat and drink this same body and blood each time we come to the Lord's Table. (At Trinity, we also use this opportunity to have the Rite of First Communion.) The service ends in silence after the altar has been stripped. The Stripping of the Altar is done to symbolize again the suffering that Jesus undergoes. All things are "stripped" away from Jesus—his friends, his dignity, and, ultimately, his life. The altar remains bare until Easter Sunday.

This year we will also have a special form for the confession and absolution at the Maundy Thursday service. Rather than me speaking a general absolution from the chancel area, each person will be invited to approach the altar and kneel to receive absolution individually from me following the general confession.

Good Friday is really a continuance of the Maundy Thursday service. Maundy Thursday ends with Jesus finishing the Passover meal with his disciples. Good Friday picks up with Jesus' betrayal, arrest, trial, and execution. This service is somber, yet we call it "good" because of the incredible gifts won for us by Christ on the cross. The readings for the day are interspersed with moments of silence and hymn verses to allow us to ponder anew Jesus' sacrificial love. The service ends with a series of Reproaches. These statements bring awareness to the fact that we are responsible for putting Christ on the cross. There is so much more that I could say about Holy Week and the services during the week. It is my hope that you will take advantage of these unique opportunities to join together as the body of believers. If there are questions about them that I didn't cover here, please ask! I love to talk about this stuff!

Each year the preschool comes together with St. Jude's Research Hospital to teach the children the importance of bike safety while raising money for childhood cancer research. Bike safety week will be Monday, April 23rd - Friday, April 27th.

St. Jude's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee is the first institution established for the sole purpose of conducting basic and clinical research into catastrophic childhood diseases, mainly cancer.

St. Jude's Research Hospital sends us a week long program that teaches the children about bike safety with story color sheets, reading book and DVD. The DVD is about Bikewell Bear and lessons about bike safety.

We are asking each child to donate \$1.00 or more that would go towards St. Jude's Research Hospital to help families in need with the cost of treatments for their child who has cancer.

St. Jude's Research Hospital was founded by the late entertainer Danny Thomas. The hospital is an internationally recognized biomedical research dedicated to childhood cancer. Patients care and research are supported through funds raised by ALSAC which is American Lebanese Syrian Associated Charities.

ALSAC covers all cost not covered by insurance for medical treatment rendered at St. Jude's Research Hospital. Families without insurance are never asked to pay. With the support of you and others more than 18,750 patients have been successfully treated at St. Jude's Research Hospital.

As a preschool we teach the children about what donations are and how we can help families in need. With each child's donation of \$1.00 or more to St. Jude's Research Hospital for support, we can help millions around the world both through increased safety and cancer research and treatment. Let's try to raise as much money as we can to help these families in need.

- **DEVOTION** – Pastor opened meeting with a prayer and devotion.
- **HISTORICAL MARKER** – Grace Holtkamp presented opportunity for TLC to get a historical marker. If so, we need to submit an application. There is a fee of \$100 (NR) and also a cost for the marker. We need to decide between September 1 to November 15, 2012.
- Minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. Dale moved and Geraldine seconded that the minutes be accepted. Motion passed.

• **OLD BUSINESS**

- DCE Call Committee Update – Job description has been submitted and we are waiting on available applicants to review.
- Church Sign – Agreed to put on hold for now (it will be discussed later in meeting)
- Telecare – It was suggested that we use this as a way to remind members about upcoming events, such as Pictorial Directory, Fellowship Events, etc.

• **REPORTS**

- **TREASURER (Linda)** – See report provided by Linda for details. We need to bring in more than we spent (YES!). No DCE spends (refund on rent + utilities). It should be noted that 2012 Housing Allowance for Pastor will be the same. Linda will do the form.
- **STEWARDSHIP (Geraldine)** – Jerry Leiber is doing very well (rehabbing).
- **EVANGELISM (Sue)** - We are looking at ways to involve the entire congregation in “reaching out” to visitors and those looking for a new home church. Visitor station is working well, but we need more involvement from everyone. We are looking at workshop or facilitator to assist with “Sharing Jesus” or maybe even a sermon series by the Pastor. We are involved with Pastor in Ministry of the Month with a purpose of showing love and spreading the Word.
- **TRUSTEES (Vernon)** – Busy with building maintenance and up keep. AC problem was not as bad as originally thought. Work day in April – not decided yet? There are two new trustees on the board: David Cash and Mark Romano.
- **ELDERS (Matt)** – Recipients of Lenten offerings will be decided at March meeting.
- **EDUCATION (Audra)** – Over 70’s Valentine Lunch was big success. Valentine picture frame was presented to all of the guests.
