The More Things Change, The More They Stay The Same

As a devotional resource, each morning in my office I read from the Treasury of Daily Prayer. This book, which I highly recommend, contains a reading from the Old Testament, a reading from the New Testament, a writing from a church theologian, a hymn verse, and a prayer for each day of the year. There are also several other resources available in this book for prayer and devotional use.

A couple of weeks ago, the writing for the day was from CFW Walther, the first president of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Here is an excerpt:

There are now many preachers and laity, both learned and unlearned individuals, who no longer believe the Bible is God's Word and faith in Christ is the only way to salvation. With their own imagined virtue and good works, they believe that they have made God their debtor, that He must rightfully receive them into heaven after their death, and that He must eternally reward them. They do not want to think of themselves as sinners who are in need of a Savior. The Word of the cross is foolishness and a stumbling block to them...

I considered opening this article by simply quoting this passage and then having you guess who wrote it and when. It could have just as easily been describing life in our time. Claiming that salvation comes only through Jesus Christ is seen as narrow-minded and exclusive. We often try and justify ourselves and make excuses for the sinful lives that we lead rather than acknowledging that we are sinners in need of salvation. Indeed, the more things change, the more they stay the same. Walther, who lived in the 1800s, could have just as easily written these words if he were alive today.

Thankfully, though, the more things change, the more they stay the same. Walther lived in a world full of sinners in need of salvation, but the salvation that comes through Christ alone that was preached so faithfully by Walther and other Lutheran pastors of his day is the same Gospel that we preach today. In this case, we give thanks things don't change. Christ's death and resurrection still hold the same power that they have for the last 2000 years!

It's the most wonderful time of year again! The traffic is heavy, the stores are packed solid with cranky, pushy people, Christmas music blares merrily out of store speakers, and the news is dominated by stories about - what else? - shopping. Everywhere you turn you see Americans feeding into a shopping frenzy! However, along with the yule tide cheer, shopping sprees, Christmas feasts, eggnog, and gingerbread cakes, there is a fair share of holiday hostility as the war over Christmas heats up. Perhaps you've read the articles in the Washington Post and various news media sources concerning the ever-growing tug of war between the American Atheist Association and the Evangelical Christians.

Essentially, American Atheists and Agnostics alike are seeking to take the "Christ" out of Christmas by putting up on November 14th their annual anti-Christian billboard at the Lincoln Tunnel and several other locations. Their goal to take the religious edge out of Christmas is fueled by three main objectives. These are listed on their webiste. Their aim to convince atheists to put an end to complying with the religious

holiday by opening attacking the "myth that Christianity owns the solstice season; and to raise awareness of the organization and the movement." They feel strongly about saying what needs to be said even if it is offensive to others. After reading this article, it is apparent that taking on religion has become a new tradition with the godless who tend to feel lost at a time when the world celebrates Christ's birth. As disciples, this crusade against Christmas helps us see the importance of being Christ's disciples to all we meet. The enemy surrounds us everyday, cleverly seeking to win us over on his side. This debate between atheists and Christians reminds us of the ever-growing spiritual warfare we face daily. How do Christ's disciples respond to such attacks?

First, we need to remind ourselves of the enormous sacrifice God made by sending His son to be born into a world where He would pay for all of our sins. The miraculous gift of His son being born by the virgin Mary is the reason why we celebrate Christmas. When the angel came to announce our Lord's birth, he said, "For behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:10-11). This angel was stating that the spiritual atmosphere of the whole planet was about to be transformed! The birth of Christ marks the beginning of the redemption plan God set in place for all people. The good news that the angel is speaking of is the redemption against the forces of darkness by the Savior Christ Jesus.

The light of the world was born to give us life! As Christ's disciples, we are called to reflect His light by proclaiming the good news of great joy and by living our lives in such a way that reminds others why we believe. This Christmas season, remind others why we celebrate Christmas. Resist the widely accepted, secularized way of celebrating the season by saying "Happy Holidays." Instead, proclaim the good news by wishing others a "Merry Christmas." Or even better, "May Christ be a blessing to you this Christmas". This simple change tells others that they have a Savior who is Christ the Lord and perhaps opens the door to share the love of Christ with those who don't know Jesus. We are called to proclaim the good news to all nations and all people. As Romans 1:16 says, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvaton" (NIV).

Secondly, immulate Christ in the Christmas season by serving others and bring glory to Him through our actions. To bring glory to God means to make him recognizable. Christ says in Matthew 25, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me." (NIV) By serving others, we are serving Christ because Christ loves and died for all people. We are given a new life in Christ.

Allow the Holy Spirit to show you ways in which to help others in our community and our world. Give to Samaritans purse, donate food to the food pantry, sponsor a child or family in Africa, buy a Wal-Mart gift card for the Krause kids and drop it off on your next trip to Katy, give to a needy family, etc. May your gift this Christmas season be one that glorifies Christ and gives back to the Kingdom.

Food Pantry! Each year Trinity Lutheran Preschool takes up a collection of canned food items for the Christian Food Pantry. The collection will begin the first day of December.

Located by the sign-in-sign-out book is a box labeled Christian Food Pantry and we would like each child to bring an item to be placed in the box for families that would not be able to have a Christmas Dinner.

Items that can be brought are:

Canned sweet potatoes, green beans, corn, stuffing mix, cornbread mix canned fruit or you can buy or clean out your pantry for items that you do not want or use. This is a great way to do God's work by helping the less fortunate so they could have a nice Christmas with their family.

The four year old class will take a walking field trip to the Christian Food Pantry to deliver the items of food. We also need a few parents to help walk with the children. If anyone would like to bring a little wagon the day of the field trip, this would be greatly appreciated!

The field trip will take place on Friday December 16th at 10:00 am, leaving here at 9:45 am. We also need the parents to fill out a permission form. Please let your child's teacher know if you are able to help walk the children to the pantry.

The workers at the pantry will explain to the children the importance of helping one another in times of need. We may be blessed today but no one knows about tomorrow. Parents and congregational members are encouraged to bring non-perishable foods to help with the Christian Food Pantry.

Let's Be Safe! Retired Trooper Gary Pflughaupt will be at the preschool on Wednesday December 14th at 10:00 am. Mr. Gary will discuss with the children what being safe means. It means holding your parents' hands when crossing a street. Being careful not to touch the stove in case it is hot. Always ask your parents or baby sitter before you go outside to play. Or what about getting into a car even if you know the person, unless your mother or father says it is okay. And why do we have to sit in a car seat?

Mr. Gary knows that safety of children is of the utmost concern. He will teach children in a positive way to be safe without becoming fearful.

Flashlight Day! On Friday December 16th, the children may bring a flashlight to preschool labeled with their name. This is to recognize that December 24th is the longest night of the year. The children will also read the story of the Lost Sheep. They can pretend to look for their lost sheep with their flashlights.

Family of the Week!
