Filling in the Blanks

As we move along through the church year, we are now entering into the Sundays after Pentecost. This is sometimes called the Time of the Church. We also sometimes refer to it as the non-festival half of the church year. I like to think of this time of the church year as the time when we fill in all the blanks. Quite naturally, the readings during the Christmas season focused on the events surrounding the birth of Christ and his very early life. Just as naturally, the readings around the time of The Resurrection of Our Lord focused on the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. A quick glance at any of the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) will show that that pretty much covers Jesus' life.

A deeper look, though, will reveal that all kinds of things were skipped-over in the process. WE simply didn't have time to get into all of the things that Jesus said and did during his ministry among the disciples. That's where the Time of the Church comes in. Now it's time to fill in the blanks. The reading in our lectionary that always sets the tone for the day is the Gospel reading. The Old Testament reading is chosen to correspond with the Gospel readings. During this year (Year B in the lectionary) our Gospel readings will almost all be from Mark's Gospel. The readings are consecutive. We'll start in chapter 2 and go all the way through the book until we get close to the account of Jesus suffering and death again. Along the way we'll hear about his many teachings and miracles. For our Epistle readings on Sundays this summer and fall, we will hear most of Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, his letter to the Ephesians, and portions of James' epistle and the epistle to the Hebrews. One of the great advantages to using a lectionary is that over the course of three years we read a huge chunk of Holy Scripture. Year in and year out we

hear anew the story of salvation through Jesus Christ. I hope you'll continue to join us this summer as we fill in the blanks! *In Christ*,

malaria initiative Ministry of the Month

The Ministry of the Month being highlighted in June is Lutheran Malaria Initiative (LMI). LMI is an unprecedented and historic partnership of the Lutheran World Relief and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. The goal of LMI is to mobilize U.S. Lutherans to raise awareness of malaria and its daily impact on the lives of people in Africa and to raise \$45 million in the global effort to help end malaria deaths in Africa by 2015. LMI is made possibly through support from the United Nations Foundation.

Building on the success and strength of their networks already in place, the mission in Africa is straightforward: to teach people to recognize the symptoms of malaria, promote prevention and provide treatment and prevention resources.

Why Malaria?

Malaria is a life-threatening disease caused by a parasite. It is transmitted to people through the bites of malaria-carrying mosquitoes. Approximately half of the world's population is at risk for malaria. There are more than 200 million cases each year and of those infected, nearly a million die. Most malaria cases and deaths occur in sub-Saharan Africa.

Why Now?

Every 45 seconds a child dies from malaria, a disease that is both preventable and treatable. There is global momentum to fight malaria. The will is present. The knowledge of how to prevent and treat malaria is present. It is now our time to be present to make a difference in the lives of millions of people.

Simple steps to prevent, treat and contain the disease are inexpensive and effective. Now is the time to join in the fight against malaria.

Pray for those suffering from malaria and for those working to prevent, treat, and contain the disease.

Learn more about malaria and then tell everyone you know – family, friends, your congregation, and community.
