The Measure of Success

I had an opportunity to attend and honor of participating in the installation of Pastor Jeff Baxter as the pastor of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Palacios yesterday (as of the writing of this article). The congregation had been vacant for a little over a year. During the past 9 months, Pastor Baxter has served as their vacancy pastor. Once he was eligible to receive a call, the congregation went through the process of calling him as their pastor. Our Redeemer is a small congregation. Their average attendance is 35. They have 71 members. By the world’s standards, this church is a colossal failure. A 100 year old congregation that only has 71 members and only sees 35 of them on a weekly basis? They must be doing something wrong. Palacios is a town of 5,000 people. That’s small (although not much smaller than Sealy), but there are lots of Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod congregations in smaller communities that have much larger memberships. If the LCMS were a business, the Palacios branch would have been shut down years ago.

But the Church is not a business. Oh, to be sure, there are plenty of people out there who try to treat it like one. They attempt to incorporate ideas learned in the business world into the way that the church operates. When it comes to things like budgets and things of that nature it might be helpful, but in the proclamation of the Word of God and the administration of the Sacraments, it has no place. No, the success of a congregation does not depend on clever marketing techniques; it depends on God’s Word. We don’t look at the numbers and decide that we are succeeding and failing; we look at the Word of God. Are we proclaiming God’s Word in truth and purity? Are we administering the Sacraments according to Christ’s command? These are the questions we must ask ourselves as we evaluate the Church. We have the promise from God that where His Word and Sacraments are, there He is also!

Food Pantry News!

In July we had the privilege to serve 192 families, which involved 562 people, by giving them some groceries. We also gave food to 83 families that provided food for 212 school children through our summer school lunch program.

Last month I started pointing out different ways people volunteer at the pantry. Continuing with other ways people are helping, we have people come in every Tuesday morning to stock shelves getting everything ready for Wednesday morning when we give out groceries. Also, on Tuesday, rice and dried beans are taken from large sacks and put into 1 pound packages. On most Tuesdays, supplies are delivered, and someone stores them and gets everything in order. On a regular basis the Wal-Mart Distribution facility calls the pantry to pick up a load of partially damaged groceries. A volunteer then goes and gets the load. After getting back to the Pantry, food items are cleaned, sorted, and put into stock or on the shelves. Food items are also picked up from Pizza Hut every week.

What a wonderful way to serve. It's such a blessing to see how everything comes together and works out for the people that are struggling to make it in everyday life. If anyone can spare an hour or two, just let someone with the pantry know. We can always use additional help or some relief. Blessings to all and have a most joy filled month.

2012 BARBECUE AND AUCTION RESULTS

Through God's grace and love for His Kingdom, He has blessed us with another successful barbecue. We had a large number of our members who really put their "all" into the project this year and this is one of the reasons why everything went so smoothly.

According to our records, we served a total of 845 plates including the 350 plates that were sold in the drive-thru. Fourteen complimentary tickets were used. The proceeds taken in from the barbecue were \$7,887.00 in ticket sales, \$551.50 in leftover sales, \$661.25 from dessert sales, \$173.72 from the children's booth, \$391.75 from Play'n for a Prize, \$400.00 from donations, and \$7,052.00 from the silent and live auctions. Expenses were approximately \$7,151.76. We also received a \$228.38 reimbursement from the K.C.'s. This means that we have a net profit of \$10,193.84.

The net proceeds from the barbecue have been designated by the Church Council to be divided: 40% to the Trinity Building Fund, 40% Trinity's General Fund and the remaining 20% will be shared equally among the Sealy Christian Food Pantry, Helping One Another (HOA) Senior Citizens Project, Austin County Child Protective Services and the Gordon Memorial Library.

None of this could have been accomplished without each and everyone working as hard as they did and we are very thankful that we can label the 2012 Barbecue a SUCCESS!!

Ministry of the Month: Orphan Grain Train

What is Orphan Grain Train?

Orphan Grain Train is a Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Grain Train volunteers gather donations of clothing, medical supplies, food, Christian literature, and other aid to meet real needs. The Orphan Grain Train movement is a loving response to Jesus Christ's example as a servant and His love for us.

How are we going to help?

We are going to make Mercy Kits! Mercy Kits are distributed around the world as needed. Their primary purpose is to assist in disaster situations such as tornadoes, floods, earthquakes, etc....

During the first few weeks of September we will be gathering supplies for the Mercy Kits. Then on **September 23 at 8am and after church on September 30**, we will gather in the gym to assemble the Mercy Kits.

What can I donate?

Each Mercy Kit will include (NEW items only):

1. One bath towel, dark color recommended
2. One washcloth, dark color recommended
3. One bath-size bar (4 to 5 oz) of soap, any brand, in its original wrapping
4. One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging
5. One tube of toothpaste
6. One sturdy comb, remove packaging
7. 6 Band-Aids or (or similar brand), preferable 1/2" to 3/4" secured together

What if I want to donate money?

Any money donated will be used to cover the cost of shipping the Mercy Kits to the Orphan Grain Train Warehouse. If excess money is donated, we will send the donation to Orphan Grain Train for them to use to cover the shipping cost of sending the Mercy Kits (and other items) to where they are needed.

When do we start?

Now! Bring your donations to church as soon as you can, so that everything is gathered by September 23 when we start assembling the kits!

 **Treasured Portraits!** Kay Krampitz, from Treasured Portraits, will be here at 8:00 am on Wednesday September 19th to take preschool pictures and also group pictures of the children. You will receive a form and all pictures are pre-paid. All forms and money are due by Friday September 14th.

 **Snacks!** Snacks are not required by the parents but are helpful. If you go shopping and you find a good deal, pick one up for the preschool. You do not need to buy for the entire preschool. If several parents donate snack items we have enough.

If you would like to donate snacks to the preschool here are some ideas: cheese nips, honey combs, round crackers, pretzels, fruit loops, popcorn, goldfish or whatever you think is a good deal. If anyone goes to Sam's Club the children and teachers enjoy Nacho Cheese without jalapeños! We appreciate it all! When you go shopping think about the preschool!

Reinforcement! Parents, please help the teachers with the rules of the preschool at home. If your child comes home with a behavior report or the teacher lets you know about your child's day and it was not appropriate behavior, please reinforce and talk to your child about what happened at preschool. Please help him/her understand the circumstances of inappropriate and appropriate behavior.

The first two weeks of preschool are rules and manners. Ask your child about the rules in the classroom, snack time, chapel, playground and gym. When all of us are working together to reinforce the rules, this makes transition easier for your child and the teacher.

Drills! The preschool conducts monthly fire drills. This is not to frighten the children but to have them prepared in case of a fire. Other drills conducted every three months are severe weather, reverse evacuation, shelter in place and lock down drills. So if your child comes home and says we had a fire or disaster today you will know why.



Emergency Preparedness Plan! Trinity Lutheran Church Preschool is required by state law and has developed an Emergency/Disaster Plan to provide safe care for our children, should an emergency or disaster occur during the program day.

Relocation in case of a disaster will be the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church located at 525 5th Street in Sealy, which is in walking distance.

A copy of this plan is always available for review. One copy is located in each classroom. You may come by the preschool office or ask your child's teacher if you would like to review the plan. The plan **MUST** not leave the classroom.

A Parent/Guardian from each family is asked to sign that they have knowledge and have reviewed the Disaster Preparedness Plan. When you sign the Parent Handbook Contract this is acknowledgment for the state that you are aware of our Disaster Plan.

I would like to thank all the parents in helping with the emergency plan by providing items needed that helps defray the cost to the preschool program.

The food will be donated to the Christian Food Pantry at the end of the year if it was not used for any disaster. This is another way you are helping the preschool and others in the community.
