Christ's Ambassadors

*"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. **We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us.** We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."*
– 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 NIV

The question is not, "Are you an ambassador for Christ?" All Christians are ambassadors for their Lord! The question is, "Are you representing Christ well to the people you meet?" What kind of idea do they get about Christ from you?

In a personal way, you can show people what God's grace in Jesus is all about. When you do something kind and helpful for someone, think about how your actions represent God's love for that person. If you have an opportunity, explain your motive in terms of your response to God's love in Christ. This is especially true if the kind action has anything to do with forgiving some grievance! Christians should be conspicuous in their eagerness to forgive and to ask forgiveness. Because we are reconciled to God through Christ, we are instruments of reconciliation among the people around us.

You can also represent Christ to others as a member of Trinity Lutheran Church. Choose one thing that was said or done in our worship service each Sunday that you could use as a "starter" for talking with a neighbor or friend about your faith and church life. For example, "Last Sunday we sang 'Just as I Am' in church. That song always reminds me that God knows all my failings but loves me anyway and has shown that love by sending Jesus to be my Savior." Write the thought down and carry it with you through the week. Each time you use it to start a conversation with someone, make a mark on the paper. Count up the marks at the end of the week. Try to beat your record from the week before!




The church floors including gym will be waxed during the week of August 18-21st. Please enter carefully!
