As human beings, and we often find ourselves in quite a jam because we are not animals. Because we are able to reason, analyze, evaluate, we end up almost trying to act like God, without obviously attaining that goal of divinity.

For example, we would like to love, to love well; to love all the time; to love everyone, but hatred and anger seem to crop up in our lives and they seem to ruin our attempts at loving.

It is much the same way with thanksgiving. I don't have to tell you here too that there is no real choice between thankfulness and unthankfulness. Happiness and thankfulness go together. In most circumstances you cannot have one without the other. And as we have also sadly learned, frustration, gloom, and discontent also go together, equally inseparable with unthankfulness.

So there is no choice for us as Christian people. We all should want to be thankful all the time and in every situation. Yet it is quite obvious that frustration and discontent many times ruin the happiness that we want in our lives.

So what's the answer to living a thankful life? Maybe if we only try harder at being thankful for everything. However, this only leads to further frustration and discontent. The answer lies first in confessing our discontent and unthankfulness to the One who has already taken our greed, our discontent, our unthankfulness into death with Him. Yes, the answer to becoming thankful lies in saying to our God: "God, we know our greed. We know our discontent. We hate it and renounce it, but we also know You because we know the great gift You have given us in Your Son, and we are glad, and we are thankful." "Being thankful is difficult" until we truly join the Psalmist who in humble spirit prayed: "O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; and His mercy endures forever."


Make that the prayer with which you get up each morning and go to sleep each night. With the Lord's mercy and love, you will be filled with much peace, joy, and thankfulness.

Preschool We

We are getting ready for

Seventeenth Preschool Congregational Annual our Thanksgiving Dinner, which will be on Thurs. November 12th, beginning at 5:30 p.m. and ending at 7:00 p.m. The cost of the ticket is \$10.00. This is the major fundraiser for the preschool which helps with the cost for teacher training, criminal background and fingerprinting of teachers, playground upkeep, classroom toys, supplies, snacks, repairs, carpet cleaning, exterminating, fire inspections, gas inspections etc., or for whatever else arises in the year. The proceeds from the Thanksgiving Dinner will help replace timbers around the wooden playground which are in need of replacing and set aside for bills to get through the summer.

MAKE A DONATION Since this is a fundraiser to benefit the preschool, we need parents and church members to donate food items towards the dinner. This is posted on the large glass window as you enter the preschool.

We are in need of sixty-five turkeys and you can purchase a turkey for **\$15.00** and make the check out to Trinity Lutheran Preschool or you can give cash. Please place your check or cash in an envelope and bring it to the preschool office. We will make one check out to H E B in Columbus, since we are purchasing the turkeys from them. Please have your turkey money donation in the office by Wednesday November 4th, so I can pick up the turkeys on Friday morning to deliver to Mikeska's in Columbus to be pit smoked.

The cost to pit smoke the turkeys is around \$650.00. Mikeska's in Columbus smokes the turkeys for the preschool. It would be a big help if you could donate money towards the smoking of the turkeys. With your help you can donate in \$5.00 increments. Make your check out to Trinity Lutheran Preschool or cash and place this in the envelope provided. All donations will need to be in the preschool or church office by Wednesday, November 4th so I can pay Mikeska's BBQ when I pick up the turkeys the day of the dinner.

Please bring to the preschool as soon as you have purchased your items. This will give me an idea of what I need to purchase for the dinner. HELPWe also have a work sign-up list to help in the kitchen. This is a very important job and beginning Monday November 9th, we begin preparation of our thanksgiving dinner. Please contact Maggie at the preschool office or church office if you would like to help in the kitchen. We try to do most of the preparation during preschool hours. Everyone may leave at NOON.



The boning turkeys is a big part of the thanksgiving dinner. We desperately need help in tearing the meat off the bones and placing the meat in pans. There is a sign-up list for church members and preschool parents to help in de-boning.

De-boning usually starts around 12:00 pm. If you can save the date, Thursday November the 12th to help de-bone, this would be greatly appreciated! Sign up if you can help.

Desserts may be brought in on Wednesday and Thursday November 11^{th} and 12^{th} in the morning. We are asking for monetary donations of \$5.00 per loaf of bread and I will order and pick up the bread for the dinner at Bill's Country Market. If you would like to bake Mrs. Smith's pies, that would be great also. We try not to make this difficult for anyone, so just remember to be simple.

Tickets will be on sale Monday October 19th for **\$10.00.** Once we reach our limit of 500 tickets sold, no tickets will be sold after that time. The kitchen is only equipped to handle about 500 plates. No tickets sold the night of the dinner. Remember that this is a fundraiser and by the time we pay to pit smoke the turkeys, purchase the dry goods and ingredients for the dressing, it is worthwhile to have this fundraiser! Please have all items here at the preschool by Wednesday, November 4th. Can goods and turkey money may be brought in as soon as possible.
