# Our Pastor Being Helpless: Being Hopeful

<sup>5</sup>Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup>who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup>but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup>And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Philippians 2:5-8 ESV

I can't think of anyone who desires to become helpless! For myself, the past couple of months, I have been, for the most part, helpless. My double hernia surgery was very simple and pain free with a little soreness. I had no problems with the surgery itself, but the worst part of the situation was the recovery. I felt helpless! The doctor said I couldn't lift anything over five pounds. Oh, limitations, limitations! That means I can't even pick up a gallon of milk.

During my recovery, I worked at home for a few days which was harder than expected. I would look around and see all the things that needed to be done and I couldn't do it or I shouldn't do it. Maybe you feel or have felt the same way, helpless. In my opinion, there is nothing worse than being helpless! (By the way, thanks to all of you who helped me and my family during my time of helplessness.)

That's also where we are spiritually: HELPLESS. As St. Paul reminds us: the good I want to do, I don't do; and the bad I don't' want to do, I keep on doing. We confess this regularly in our confession of sins in worship, "We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone." HELPLESS!

Now as we celebrate the birth of our Savior, God reminds us of His Son becoming helpless for us. He sent His Son, Jesus, into the world not as a valiant warrior or even as some super hero. He sent Jesus into the world to be conceived of the virgin Mary and to be born as a human infant yet also completely being God. God became "helpless". He had no input on His city of birth, the tiny, little villa of Bethlehem. He had no input on His birthplace, a feeding trough for animals. Jesus, the true Son of God came into our sin-filled world as a helpless infant. He truly emptied Himself as a servant for us. As we celebrate the birth of our Savior, we don't only leave our attention on the helpless infant in the wooden manger in Bethlehem. We also focus on the helpless servant who was crucified on the blood stained wooden cross of Calvary. Jesus became helpless for us so that we who were helpless by our sinful condition might be justified before our Father. Through Jesus, we are no longer helpless but HOPEFUL! And this being hopeful is having the full assurance of eternal life.

We celebrate Christmas, the birth of our Savior, when God's Son became helpless so that we are now hopeful with eternal life. Blessings to all of vou this

**Food Pantry!** Each year Trinity Lutheran Preschool takes up a collection of canned food items for the Christian Food Pantry. The collection will begin the first day of December.

Located by the sign-in-sign-out book is a box labeled Christian Food Pantry and we would like each child to fill and bring items to be placed in the box for families that would not be able to have a Christmas Dinner.

Items that can be brought are

canned sweet potatoes, green beans, corn, stuffing mix, cornbread mix, canned fruit or you can buy or clean out your pantry for items that you do not want or use and are not outdated. This is a great way to do God's work by helping the

less fortunate so they could have a blessed Christmas with their family.

The four year old class will take a walking field trip to the Christian Food Pantry to deliver the items of food. We also need a few parents to help walk with the children. If anyone would like to bring a little wagon the day of the field trip, this would be greatly appreciated!

The field trip will take place on Friday December 11<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am, leaving here at 10:00 am. We also need the parents to fill out a permission form. Please let your child's teacher know if you are able to help by donating a wagon and or walk the children to the pantry.

The workers at the pantry will explain to the children the importance of helping one another in times of need. We may be blessed today but no one knows about tomorrow. Parents and congregational members are encouraged to bring non-perishable foods to help with the Christian Food Pantry.

Veranda House Field Trip! After delivering the collected food to the Sealy Christian Food Pantry around 11:00 am the children will walk to the Veranda House for senior living, which a privately owned personal care home providing daily care to senior citizens. Veranda House is located across from the Sealy Christian Food Pantry and the children will visit and sing Christmas Carols to the residents. Remember that field trip forms must be filled out to attend.

Let's Be Safe! Retired Trooper Gary Pflughaupt will be at the preschool on Wednesday, December 9<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am. Mr. Gary will discuss with the children what being safe means. It means holding your parents' hands when crossing a street or careful not to touch the stove in case it is hot. Always ask your parents or baby sitter before you go outside to play, or what about getting into a car, even if you know the person, unless your mother or father says it is okay. Also why do we have to sit in a car seat?

Mr. Gary knows that safety of children is of the utmost concern. He will teach children in a positive way to be safe without becoming fearful.

Flashlight Day! On Thursday, December 17<sup>th</sup> the children may bring a flashlight to preschool labeled with their name. This is to recognize that December 22<sup>nd</sup> this year is the longest night of the year. The children will also read the story of the Lost Sheep. They can pretend to look for their lost sheep with their flashlights.

**Pajama Day!!** All children! Wear your pajamas to preschool and enjoy the morning with the movie Polar Express on Friday, December 18<sup>th</sup>! We will have a special snack while watching the movie.

**Family of the Week!** Family of the week is a program we have that aids children in being able to share their family with everyone at preschool and church. Each week a family will be chosen to be Family of the Week.
