When Dr. Billy Graham and his wife, Ruth, were first married, they were like most young couples, a little short on money.

One Sunday as they sat together in worship, the offering plate was passed and Billy grabbed a bill from his wallet. He thought it was a dollar as he dropped it in the offering plate. Yet when he saw the bill in the plate, he noticed that he had by mistake placed in a ten-dollar bill. What was he to do? He was too embarrassed to retrieve it, so he sat there, chagrined by his mistake.

Afterwards, when he and Ruth talked about it, she kidded him by saying, "And in the eyes of the Lord you'll not get credit for ten dollars, since one dollar was all you planned to give."

Most of us have had similar experiences. But surely does God keep books on us, checking to see if our intentions match our gifts? Surely God is more concerned about the condition of our hearts and the status of our spirits than about how much we give.



drink on Friday, May 20th to enjoy the day outside with our Back Yard Picnic! Whether we have rain or not we will enjoy the day!




