Priorities Portray Our Loyalty

Charles, a ten-year old boy, was failing math. His parents knew the importance of education so they hired a tutor. After

two weeks, the parents noticed that his grades were getting worse. They began thinking that their son might have a psychological problem, therefore they hired a psychologist. The counselor met with the lad a few times but it still didn't work. The psychologist then suggested that Charles should go through hypnosis, which also failed.

Charles' parents started wondering if he had some sort of learning disability. They visited with his teacher who had the school counselor test him for any learning problems. The results of the test declared that Charles had no disabilities and that he had an above average intellect.

Cautiously, his mother opened it, and to her surprise, she saw his math grade, "A." Thrilled at his remarkable progress, Charles' parents rushed into his room. The father investigated, "Charles, we just want to know what helped you in math. We've tried everything with you: tutoring, psychology, hypnosis, testing. Was it the different school, maybe the textbook, the teacher, what?" Charles answered, "On that first day when I walked in the front door of the school and saw that guy nailed to the 'plus sign,' I just knew that they meant business."

MINUTES OF THE CONGREGATIONAL MEETING OF TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH ON APRIL 24, 2016

President Dale Toellner called the meeting to order. Pastor Bersche said the prayer.

Minutes from Congregational Meetings on April 26, 2015 and October 25, 2015 were read for approval. Motion made by Doyle Kornegay to accept minutes as read. Carol Jean Hauschild seconded the motion. All approved. Motion past.

The Pre-school Board ballot of Stacey Picard was read to the congregation. Board member rolling off is Denise Kopecky. The floor was open to nominations with none presented. Robert Richter made motion to accept nomination as presented by acclamation. Ron Hartmann seconded the motion. All approved. Motion carried.

Valerie Engelbrecht presented information on Thrivent funding through action teams with discussion following. This funding can be used for fundraisers, service projects and educational projects or events and if approved will receive \$250 debit card for seed money to put on event. Grace Holtkamp is Project Coordinator.

The lights in Sanctuary have been changed to LED lights. There are more lights still needing to be changed out. The electric bill has gone down since changing lights to LED.

Andy Rebber with Verdin Company gave presentation on Carillon church bell electronic system because the middle church bell no longer works. The options are to a) repair the present bells for \$9,800 except lift to get to bells or b) the electronic Carillon bells that works the same plus can play music to include 450 hymns from the Lutheran Hymnal for either \$9,600 or \$11,800 installed with 5 year warranty. Questions were discussed. The Estella Meyer Estate of \$10,000 in Designated Funds can be used to purchase bell system. *Motion made by Rebecca Tipton to purchase the electronic Carillon system with USB for \$11,800 and seconded by George Wied. All approved. Motion past. **Motion made by Carol Jean Hauschild to use the Estella Meyer Estate Designated Fund of \$10,000, a celebration for her family for dedication and further funds from the Memorial Fund to cover cost of bell system. Rebecca Tipton seconded the motion. All approved. Motion past. The current bells will be kept.

Dale Toellner resigned as Church Council President effective April 30th due to medical issues. Vice President George Wied will take over as President.

There being no further business, President Toellner called for a motion to adjourn. Motion was made by Robert Richter, seconded by George Wied to adjourn. All approved. Motion past.
