No Pain, No Gain

In the early 1980's, the phrase, "no pain, no gain" came into being. Largely in part due to Jane Fonda who produced numerous aerobic workout videos. She would constantly use the phrase along with other catchphrases as, "Feel the burn." These sayings she used to convey the idea that one must experience working out past the point of experiencing muscle aches.

Numerous other fitness gurus after her have also jumped on the "no pain, no gain" band wagon. These terms of discomfort for the sake of beneficial muscle and aerobic gain seemed to motivate those working out. Simply put in terms of physical development, muscle soreness comes from the tearing down of the muscle tissue so that the body will rebuild more dense fibers, making a bigger, stronger muscle.

However, one must realize, while working out, the difference between a "sore pain" versus a detrimental pain. This sort of pain can be caused by many factors such as joint arthritis. In my personal case, I experienced pain from walking (as many of you already know) for the last three to five years. Yet after my hip replacement surgery, the pain no longer is a detrimental pain but a "sore pain." For me the phrase, "no pain, no gain" was not a good phrase because it meant more destruction for my hip joint. Now, while going through physical therapy, the phrase means a lot more.

During my surgery and now as I continue to recover, you, my brothers and sisters in Christ have been extremely supportive with your cards, visits, and prayers. For these and for all of you, I thank you with great appreciation.

I would like to share with you one more thought based upon the phrase, "no pain, no gain." Whether you are one who constantly works out or one who never even thinks about lifting one finger for physical exercise, the phrase is relative to us all. For God sent His Son, Jesus, to live a perfect life that we can't live. For God sent His Son, Jesus, to suffer cruel and miserable "pain" for us on the cross. He suffered true pain that we all really deserve. And through His "fatal pain", God gives us the gain of eternal life.

As you continue your summer schedules, please always keep in mind, "no pain, no gain" or in other words: with Jesus - His pain is your gain.

Country Store of Sweets, Jellies and Relishes





MINUTES OF TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING June 12, 2017

The Trinity Lutheran Church Council meeting was called to order by President, George Wied. George opened the meeting with prayer. Johanna Buechmann presented the devotion, True Freedom, stressing that we not only have the freedom of living in the greatest country, but we also have freedom in Christ. We are free in our Spirit to serve the Creator of the whole Universe.

The Minutes from the meeting held on May 8, 2017, were presented for review and approval. A motion was made by Carol Jean Hauschild, seconded by Bill Blume, to accept the minutes as presented. All Council members approved and the motion passed.

Unfinished/Old Business:

- The hall rental rates were discussed and it was decided that the rental contract would be revised.
- The facility will only be rented to members. Rental of the gym and kitchen area will require a \$100.00 cleaning deposit. This deposit is refundable, after the event, if there is no damage and if the facility is left in a clean state. The cost for 5 hours will be \$150.00, with \$50.00 per hour for every hour that exceeds 5 hours.
- Rental for the upstairs room will require a \$50.00 cleaning deposit and will cost \$75.00

for 4 hours, with a charge of \$50.00 per hour over 4 hours.

- Cancellation must be made within 5 days prior to the event, or the deposit may not be refunded. This will be based on the reason for the cancellation.
- After this discussion, a motion was made by Ron Hartmann and seconded by Ruth Szymanski to have Bill Blume and Maggie Kent draw up a new contract to be reviewed by Council. All Council members approved and the motion passed.
- The pictorial directory was discussed and an attempt will be made to schedule more dates for pictures to be taken.

Chairmen Reports

Carol Jean Hauschild – Treasurer

- The May 31, 2017, Treasurer's report was presented. The cash balance in the General Fund is \$115,496.17. The Building Fund balance is \$50,952.63 and the Designated Funds balance is \$46,731.75. The Total of all Funds is \$213,180.55.
- The funds from the Lenten, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services have been moved to the General Fund.
- The money in the Designated Funds for the Ice Machine has been paid out, and that project is complete.

Jerry Leiber – Stewardship Chairman

- Jerry reminded Council that the budget items are due by September.

Johnnie Sodolak – for Lee Hobratschk - Elder Chairman

- Johnnie reported that the Elders will be sure that the nursery is open on Sundays for parents with small children to use.
- The Elders approved that Maggie's office close at noon on Fridays, effective June 16, 2017 through August 5, 2017. After discussion, the council suggested that Maggie be given off all day on Fridays, from current through August 5, 2017. The motion was made by Ruth Szymanski and seconded by Susie Hartmann. Council approved and the motion passed.

Ron Hartmann – Vice President

- Nothing to report

Pastor Bersche

- Pastor reported that his first day back at work was June 12, 2017, and he appreciated all the prayers and all of the support he received. He will return to the Pulpit on Sunday, June 18.

Valerie Engelbrecht – Education Chairman

- Vacation Bible School will be held Tuesday, June 20, through Thursday, June 22, from 6 to 8 pm.
- The Mission of VBS is to collect camping type of food for the Sealy Food Pantry.
- Valerie has received "Seed" money from Thrivent to help defray the costs of VBS.

Susie Hartmann – Evangelism Chairman

- Thrivent "Seed" money was used to offset the cost of the Picnic on the Playground, which was very successful and enjoyed by all who attended.

Bill Blume – Trustee Chairman

- There was a discussion on the salary of the Janitorial staff. The Council decided to leave the salary as is, but will review at the time of the budget for next year.
- Bill will be reviewing other cleaning businesses to look at their costs.

Johanna Buechmann – Usher Chairman

- Nothing to report

Maggie Kent – Preschool

- Nothing to report

A motion was made by Carol Jean Hauschild to accept the Chairmen Reports as presented. Ron Hartmann seconded the motion. All Council members approved the Reports and the motion passed.

New Business

- Jeannette Simmons donated a beautiful plaque to the church. Council discussed where it should be displayed and it was decided that the Altar Guild will make that decision.
- The Church has received a generous gift of \$25,000.00 from the Estate of Sidney Dell Johnston Remmert. These funds will be placed in a Designated Fund to use for a special project.
- The Pastors' wives retreat will be held on September 22 and 23 at Camp Lone Star. A motion was made by Carol Jean Hauschild, and seconded by Susie Hartmann, approving Pastor's wife to attend if she would like to. All approved and the motion passed.
- Discussion continued about finding someone to re-finish the front doors to the Church.

There being no further business, Ron Hartmann made a motion to adjourn. Susie Hartmann seconded the motion. All approved and the motion passed. George Wied will have the devotion for the next meeting, July 10, 2017. The meeting closed with prayer by Pastor Bersche.
