# "Significant to Jesus"

Significant! That is who we are in the eyes of the Lord.

Sometimes people may introduce to others that one person that means the most to them. They introduce them as being "my significant other". What we are saying is that one person is greatly significant and important to us.

That is how Jesus also sees us. We are His "significant" other. Remember that you are precious in His sight. After all, you are so significant that He came to this world, lived for us, kept the law perfectly for us, died a sacrificial death for us, and rose for us. He did all those significant things for "you"- His Significant Ones.

Take another look at that word: "significant" especially the words within it. The first part of the word is: "sign". When one notices a sign they understand that what is to come is quite important. You are driving down a road and you come to a busy intersection where there is a stop sign. Now it is important that you do what the sign says: stop! The second part of the word is "if I cant". When it comes to your eternal life in Christ, on our own, that phrase says it all. The Bible reminds us that when it comes to eternal salvation we cannot accomplish it. So, "IF I CANT" then who can accomplish it. The answer sounds so sweet in our ears as believers: Jesus!

As we continue to contemplate the significant actions of our God through His Son, Jesus Christ, let us understand how we also are significant to Him. At Christmas, the common statement that we make as Christians (and rightly so) is "Jesus is the Reason for the Season." For Lent, we not only continue to relate that in our lives we also know that it was out of God's grace and mercy that Jesus came, died, and rose. In other words, Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so.


We are significant to God so let us make Him significant in our lives as well. Let us make our worship of Him a top priority. Let us spiritually grow in His significant life, death, and resurrection.



As you see the flower with that beautiful smile is how Trinity Lutheran Preschool Board and I feel about 2021-2022 school year to continue to teach children in our community about our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.



Preschool discussed with Church Council the issues we were faced since Covid19 sneaked into all of our lives. If you were at the congregational

meeting and listened to Patsy Romano's story telling you of Pastor Bersche and Trinity Lutheran Preschool is a ministry to the community, ministry to our own church family, teaching our preschoolers the love of helping people in need, ministry to the families who want to learn English, celebrating the life of Jesus, learning memory verses, learning the Ten Commandments and the meaning behind each one, learning the Pledges to the American Flag, Christian Flag, Bible and the Pledge to the Cross. Children learn Bible Stories, songs and finger plays. Our teaching is focused around Jesus.

Patsy talked about the children when they sing once a year in church in front of their parents and the congregation, how they can make us smile, laugh, fill our hearts with joy and most of all beautifully say the Lord's Prayer. Children are a special gift from God and they are our future.

The children who graduate from Trinity Lutheran Preschool are well prepared for kindergarten. We teach in such a way the children don't even realize they are learning.

As for their future we plant the seed, teaching Jesus Christ loves them and He is an important part of our lives as we grow in faith. When they grow into adults, they themselves plant the seed of Jesus to children and families. This is how Trinity Lutheran Preschool and Church is a ministry to families.

Preschool is an outreach and we are not here to change family's home church to belong to Trinity. We are here to minister to families who do not attend church, who are looking for a church home and to let those families know that they are always welcome to attend Trinity Lutheran Church.

Preschool informed the Church Council that we would need of approximately \$25,000 to \$30,000 in order to re-open for the fall of 2021-2022. Preschool went to the bank to inquire about a loan, but the Preschool is not able to take out a loan on its own. The Church will need to borrow the money for the Preschool. Church Council suggested maybe the church can loan the money with the terms of repayment as a need base and not go over \$30,000.00. Church Council at this time must present this issue to the congregation for a vote.

To be honest I prayed knowing this was a tough decision for me as well as for others knowing the church paid \$50,000 from current funds and borrowed \$50,000 from the bank paying for the HVAC unit. Now the church has a monthly payment expense to the bank. I know how important preschool is and I did not want preschool to be a burden on the church. When Pastor Gil Franke spoke and said where is our faith? We all have to have faith. The vote was 63 in favor and 11 not in favor.

Amazing how God works in our lives of tough decisions, tears, broken hearts, changes, changes and more changes and sometimes wanting to give it all up. Do you think God was testing all of us? A few days after that congregational meeting, we found out the \$7000.00 small business loan through our PPP loan, we now do not have to pay that loan back. They will also reimburse the couple of payments already made to the bank. Now that is what I call faith!

Thank you to the Congregation for continuing Trinity Lutheran Preschool and Church Council in helping and preparing us to go forth in front of the congregation for good or not so good news. My heart melted to hear the words of members who really support our church and preschool program. Those kind words will be with me forever. Church Council presented the issue at the Congregational meeting that took place on Saturday and Sunday, January 30, and 31, 2021, to vote to lend money on terms of repayment to the preschool or close the doors for good.

Thank you Lord for giving strength and courage to Terry Hankins, Church Council, Pastor Bersche, Barry Wolf, Preschool Board Congregation, and myself, to learn from each other, to improve where we went wrong, and to cope with so many changes. Lord, You are the one I give all praise and glory and thanking You for bringing and uniting all of us during this time of need. Amen.
