Life In Christ, an Example of Service

I can still hear my brother, Bob, laughing at me from the short stop position on the softball field. I was playing left field and having many stressful difficulties. And in my aggravation, he could hear me using quite colorful language as I played in the outfield.

When I was younger, every year our circuit of churches would get together for a co-ed slow pitch softball tournament. The year I remember was the year AAL sponsored our tournament at First Lutheran Church in Ponca City, Oklahoma. Now their softball field had an obstacle in it. In the middle of left field stood a large oak tree. The rules that we played by were that the outfielder still had to play the ball in the tree. Let me tell you, its not fun when a pop fly gets hit into the tree and hits a dozen branches on its way down. In the meantime, the base runner is cruising around the bases.

Looking back on that memory, I realize how competitive I was and how foolish and immature. Back then I regarded winning the game meant almost everything. Yet sometimes I wonder if that attitude takes hold of our Christian life and values as well.

It's quite easy to get frustrated and envious of other Christians. Especially when we hear all the great and marvelous things that other Christians are doing for the kingdom. You might feel the same way sometimes. Instead of remembering Jesus' words in Scripture, our mind reverts back to competition. We many times sound like Jesus' disciples, "Who is the greatest?"

St. Mark records for us: And they came to Capernaum. And having been in the house He was asking them, "What on the road were you discussing?" But they were silent with each other for they had been discussing on the road, who was the greatest. And having sat down He called the twelve and he says to them, "If anyone wishes to be first he will be last of all and a servant of all." Having taken a child, He set him in their midst and having taken him in His arms He said to them, "Whoever shall receive one such as little children in My name, he receives Me and whoever receives Me does not receive Me but the One having sent Me. (Mark 9:33-37)

Notice in this and other passages of Scripture, there is NO competition. There is NO room for being greater or better than others. There is only the example that Jesus gives us- to serve and not to be served. He is the ultimate example of this. He gave up His glorious throne in heaven. He came to earth as a newborn child. He grew up in a depressing, sin-filled world. He showed us a life of service to others. And that life of service ultimately is seen as He gave up His life into death on the cross where He suffered death for our sins. He rose from the dead to give us resurrected life. He ascended into heaven and before He left, He gave us the right to be called children of God (His greatness) through baptism.

Mark's account in chapter 9 continues. Sometime after this greatness controversy takes place, John comes to Jesus with an issue, or at least he sees it as an issue. "Teacher, we saw someone in Your name casting out demons and we were forbidding Him because he was not following us." Sounds familiar with churches who should be serving but instead feel that they are in competition with each other. Jesus responds to us and to John: Do not forbid him for no one is able to do a mighty work in my name will be able soon afterward to speak evil of me. For the one who is not against us is for us. (Mark 9:38-40)

Therefore, we rejoice and praise God for other Christians, especially when they serve. We rejoice with other Christian congregations when they are growing, serving, and proclaiming the Gospel in their community. We are glad that the kingdom is NOT a competition with winners and losers. We rejoice that God has already won the victory over sin, death, and the devil with His Son Jesus.
