Life In Christ, an Example of Service How Long, O LORD?

Psalm 13 asks the same question that often is on our minds, especially during these times. David, the Psalmist asks, "How long..." not once but four times: (1) How long, O LORD? Will You forget me forever? (2) How long will You hide Your face from me? (3) How long must I take counsel in my soul and have sorrow in my heart all the day? And (4) How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?

It is on our hearts and minds as well. "How long?" As in, "How long will this pandemic last?" or "How long will we be having church in this way?" But this question we all are asking shouldn't come to any surprise. Unfortunately, we have been somewhat indoctrinated into our fast-paced culture. The word, "wait" is now a bad word that we don't like to hear. Patience may be a virtue but we many times lack it. I find myself many times wondering when the traffic will clear and I can get to where I am going.

Even more so, we should contemplate the words of Psalm 13 in our day. Although we ask, "How long, O Lord?" the Psalmist answers the question in verse five: "But I have trusted in Your steadfast love. Instead of impatience and frustration listen to the result of trusting in the Lord: "My heart shall rejoice in Your salvation!" Our response to our own question, "How long?" should be of rejoicing. As David concludes the psalm, "I will sing to the Lord for He has dealt bountifully to me!"

Truly, the Lord has dealt bountifully to us, His people. Jesus has taken away our sins. Although He never promises to take away the inevitable temporal death we all will face, He does promise to take away eternal death by His death and resurrection. How long? We ask this patiently always knowing that God is in control.

Sealy Christian Pantry H.O.P.E. Campaign

The Sealy Christian Pantry has felt the effects of the Pandemic, just like everyone else. Beginning in March of 2020, the Pantry was forced to close the doors at their location on Ward Street here in Sealy. As soon as those doors were closed by the city of Sealy, God furnished a bigger and better door. Since that time, the Pantry has been distributing food from LifeBridge Church, which has worked well, allowing for a drive thru distribution. Changes from the Houston Food Bank have emphasized the need for this type of distribution, as well as warehouse storage. Prior to the Pandemic, food was delivered by cases. Now food is delivered by pallets. At any given time, there is an average of 50 to 75 pallets of food in the back of the sanctuary at LifeBridge. As well, LifeBridge

has freezers and other equipment onsite to successfully store and handle the food. The use of their church was meant to be a short-term, temporary solution, never a permanent solution.

The time has come for the Sealy Christian Pantry to have their own facility once again. Through a lot of prayers and generous supporters, the Pantry was able to purchase land for the new facility on Old San Felipe Rd in Sealy. The next step is to raise funds for a 5000 square foot warehouse/office facility. Obviously, this is a huge endeavor, and the Pantry has begun a fundraising campaign to work towards this goal----H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Eat). In the Narthex, there is a table set up with a container of green bracelets, as well as a jar to place contributions in. The bracelets are to serve as a reminder to pray for this campaign. We ask that you prayerfully consider doing one of the following:

- Take a bracelet and make a donation
- Take a bracelet and remember to pray for the hungry and for success for this campaign
- Take a bracelet, pray for the success of this campaign and make a donation.

Any and all will be greatly appreciated!

To help you understand the magnitude of what the Pantry has been through during the Pandemic, here are some 2020-2021 statistics:

- Prior to the Pandemic, we served 75-100 families each week. Those families received food every other week.
- During March 2020 thru December 2020, the Pantry served 225-250 families every week. Those families represented 750-1000 family members each week.
- In 2020, the Pantry distributed approximately 500,000 pounds of food!!
- Thru May of 2021, the Pantry averages 170-225 families each week, representing 700-950 family members being served. This equals to approximately 235,000 pounds of food through May of this year.
- The Pantry is seeing more inconsistent numbers each week (some really high and some really low) in 2021. The hope is that the Pandemic is slowly improving, and that people are slowly returning to work.

Meet the teacher was a great time for you and your child to meet other parents and to get to know all the teachers who will be in your child's life, teaching them about Jesus Christ. Trinity Lutheran Preschool has been blessed with teachers who are enthusiastic, dedicated, and loving. These teachers are role models, planners, facilitators, observers, record keepers, a support system, team players, communicators, conflict resolvers or better known as your child's teacher. Words cannot describe what a blessing they are to me and Trinity Lutheran Preschool. The teachers have work very hard to prepare for this fantastic school year!

ROUTINE!



We all know how important A, B, C's and 1, 2, 3's are, and the most

important lesson your child will learn is to know that Jesus loves them. Not only do we learn about Jesus, but we also teach and prepare your child for kindergarten beginning in the two-year-old class followed by the three-year-old class and completed in the four year old class.

The preschool doors will open at 8:00 am and will be closed at 8:15 am. Please arrive by 8:00 am and no later than 8:15 am since the teachers begin their class as soon as your child

walks through the door. We all know the importance of starting a day off right!

Young children need structure and routines to feel secure in their preschool environment. By having a clear morning routine to start a day at preschool, children will know what to expect and feel safe at school. Put yourself in your child's position if the person you are depending on gets you to work late continually? It is not fun for your child to begin their day when you throw off their schedule and cause anxiety and unhappiness when you drop them off to preschool. Your child wants to be here when the other children arrive

and enjoy their friendship. By allowing your child time to adjust to the classroom, friends, teacher, and environment will help them feel included and it will have a positive feeling for the rest of the day. Teachers begin the morning with instructions as simple as placing their backpacks where they belong or name recognition that they will miss out on if they are late. There are many things happening early when these children arrive. *Teaching Begins!!*



Themes for the month are

Creation/Self/Safety/Friendship/Manners/ Kindness and Grandparents Day. The spiritual emphasis is to help children discover that the Bible tells us about God and His creation.

The children will learn letters, numbers, shapes, and colors. Throughout the year we have a teaching calendar and children learn matching, go-together, sequencing, lotto's, letter sound matches, categorizing, picture sound matches and much more. Ongoing skills are practiced everyday such as listening, following directions, and manners.

Learning centers allows the children to play cooperatively and investigate language, roles, materials, and relationship's and encourages children to learn at their own pace with material that meet individual needs and level of development. While children learn through play, they can learn essential skills such as problem solving, working with others, sharing and much more. In turn, this helps them develop the ability to concentrate.

The children will start off with the Bible stories during Chapel on how God created the world. Children will learn songs; finger plays and pledges and memorize Bible verses. Listen to your child and all the wonderful things they learn in the classroom, in Chapel and while playing.

Red/White/Blue Day! With all the natural disasters that are occurring, the children can wear Red/White and Blue on Wednesday, September 10^{th.} The colors RED/WHITE and BLUE will represent the 911 tragedy. We are going to focus on the fact that so many heroes came out of 9/11 to step up to do the right thing.

Wear RED Day! Since the children are learning red for the month, we will have a special color day. On Wednesday, September 15th, the children can come to preschool dressed in something RED to reinforce the color!

Back Yard Bash! On Friday, September 17th, all the preschoolers will have a BACK YARD BASH Day! Each

child needs to bring a sack lunch with a drink to school and enjoy the day outside playing! This is a great way for all the children to get to know one another, have fun and create memories. Let's pray that we will have nice weather to enjoy. If not, we will have Trinity's beautiful gym for the children to enjoy their lunch.



Special Book Week! Beginning Monday September $20^{th} - 24^{th}$ preschool will have Special Book Week! Another way we make reading fun is to have your child

bring some of their books from home (please label with name) a pillow, blanket, and favorite stuffed animal. The teacher will read some of the books and let the children share their books while relaxing with their items brought from home. Children can tell each other their story books and open a world of imagination.

Reading is very important in a young child's life. Encouraging reading is important and we try to make it fun! It gives them an opportunity to listen, explore, and imagine what triggers their brain to answer questions after a story is read. Let's get ready to read!

Bring Snacks for Your Child Each Day!

Please bring simple snacks in a plastic zipper snack bag each day for your child. Ideas are cheese nips, any kind of cereals. Sandwich crackers, pretzels, goldfish or whatever you think your child will eat. This is a snack and not a meal. The children have only a ten-minute snack time.



When you order books using the paper order form, please make checks payable to Scholastic. Cash is not accepted. To pay by credit card, purchase books club your using the website (clubs.scholastic.com), entering the class activation code from your child's teacher to ensure that TLP receives your order. It takes one to two weeks after the order due date for the books to arrive.



Reinforcement! Parents. please help the teachers with the rules of the preschool at If your child comes home.

home with a behavior report or the teacher lets you know about your child's day and there was inappropriate behavior, please reinforce and talk to your child about what happened at preschool. Please help him/her understand circumstances of inappropriate and appropriate behavior.

The first two weeks of preschool are rules and manners. Ask your child what the rules are in the classroom, snack time, chapel, playground and gym. When all of us are working together to reinforce the rules, this makes transition easier for your child and the teacher.



Drills! The preschool conducts monthly fire drills. This is not to frighten the children but to have them prepared in case of a fire. Other drills

conducted every three months are severe weather, reverse evacuation, shelter in place and lock down drills. If your child comes home and says we had a fire or disaster today, you will know why.



Preparedness Emergency Plan! Trinity Lutheran Church

Preschool is required by state law and has an Emergency/Disaster

Plan to provide safe care for our children, should an emergency or disaster occur during the program day.

Relocation in case of a disaster will be the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church located at 525 5th Street in Sealy, which is in walking distance. A copy of this plan is always available for review. One copy is in each classroom. You may come by the preschool office or ask your child's teacher if you would like to review the plan. The plan MUST not leave the classroom. A Parent/Guardian from each family is asked to sign that they have knowledge and have reviewed the Disaster Preparedness Plan. When you sign the Parent Handbook Contract this is acknowledgment for the state that you are aware of our Disaster Plan.

I would like to thank all the parents in helping with the emergency plan by providing items needed that help defray the cost to the preschool program. The food not used will be donated to the Christian Food Pantry at the end of the year. This is another way to help the preschool and others in the community.

Attending the Whole Week!

We encourage you to send your child five days a week. This is only

a \$50 difference. Coming five days a week is an opportunity in preparing your child to learn to share, follow instructions, and begin the foundation for learning that will occur in elementary school. Children thrive when there is consistency in care between home and school.

We notice children who come one day, miss the next, and then come again, commonly find it much more difficult to adapt to the class routine than children who attend five-days a week. We encourage five days a week noticing the difference between the children whose attendance is consistent and those who come for two or three days a week. Children attending five days a week normally make much more progress academically and socially in comparison with those children who attend a few days a week.

This is a suggestion and I know that some are not able to have their children attend all five days. I want you to know the difference between attending three days versus five days. Pray about this and if this is not the right decision for you, we understand.

Please feed your child breakfast at home before preschool begins. Bringing breakfast to school interrupts the rest of the children. If your child does bring breakfast to school, please take him/her to the gym and sit down with your child and finish breakfast. You are responsible for your

child to eat breakfast and bring them to the classroom. Your child must be brought to the classroom by you. Please do not let them come to the classroom by themselves.

Late Pick Up

Please be on time in picking up your child at NOON! A late fee of \$1.00 per minute will be added to your tuition. Please be on time!

TUITION

September tuition is due by the 7th of September. All tuition is due by the 5th of each month.

TUTION, FEES, AND FUNDING

Tuition is due in advance with no deductions for any absences, holidays, illness, or closures due to inclement weather, power outages, or other situations beyond Trinity Lutheran Preschool's control. If tuition is not paid on the day that it is due, a late fee will be added to the tuition for each day that it is late until it is paid in full. When a payment is delinquent for one week or more, care may be suspended until the balance is current and your child's space will not be reserved. Tuition is due regardless of a child's absence from the program for any reason and is required to hold a child's space. Our policy for tuition is as follows:

- All accounts are due on the 5th of the month.
- Statements come home with each child's monthly newsletter, generally sent home on the last week of the previous month.
- If tuition is not paid by the 10th of the month, then a late charge of \$5.00 will be added to that month's tuition. All fees must be paid by the first of the following month or your child cannot attend until all fees are paid in full. Late charge will not exceed \$50.00 each month.
- After the 10th of the month, you will be notified by a board member to decide for the balance due or dismissal of care.

Termination

Because of the long-term benefits of participation in high-quality early childhood programs, our goal is not to suspend or expel a child from care. Instead, we attempt to collaborate with parents to bring the needed resources and strategies to a situation.

Our hope is that these efforts will result in suspensions and expulsions only being used where there are extraordinary circumstances or a determination of a serious safety threat. While we will make efforts to reduce or eliminate such circumstances and/or threats with the provision of reasonable modifications, we reserve the right to suspend or expel in any situation we deem necessary.

We can and will terminate our childcare arrangements immediately for any of the following reasons (but not solely limited to):

Failure to comply with the contract

Destructive or hurtful behavior of child that persists even with parent cooperation in stopping the behavior

Non-Payment of childcare fees or late and/or recurring late payment of fees

Failure to show up for 5 days in a row without any communication

Failure to complete required forms

Inability to meet the child's needs without additional staff

Rude and disrespectful behavior towards provider or any employee

If parents knowingly bring their child ill

Conflict between parent / provider

Extreme Behavior

PARTY GUIDEUNES

We have five special parties a year, Harvest, Christmas, Valentine, Easter and End of School party and we ask parents to help with refreshments and supervision of games.

A sign-up list will be posted for parents to help with the activity centers and food items. This will be a first come first serve base. Parents that sign up for a particular party are the ones that can attend. We need parents help by setting up and supervising the activities centers. Supervised activity centers will be on 20-minute increments. Special food and game items will be on the list for parents to purchase and provide for the parties.

A kitchen crew will be needed to prepare the food, drinks and set up the children's tables ready for them to eat and have kitchen clean before leaving.

We ask all parents to help by setting up for the party, tearing down the activity centers, cleaning kitchen, wiping tables, sweeping, and taking out the trash.

Purpose of volunteers is to make sure children are safe, lower stress on everyone, work as a team and have fun with the preschoolers. Since we are a non-profit organization, we appreciate your help in donating items and your time for the parties.

CHAPEL SERVICES SINGING IN CHURCH

A beautiful Sunday for the children to participate and sing in front of the congregation and their families. This is usually a Sunday in February or March. Everyone's heart fills with joy to hear these children perform. We ask that you set this Sunday aside for your family and watch your preschooler perform songs they learned in Chapel. The next day when the children return to preschool, they will get to watch themselves preform on the big screen in the gym.
