The month of September went very well with children and parents. This year our ratios are low since we started later then the regular schools. I

did not advertise due to not knowing what the state's ratio number of children would be with the pandemic. I look everywhere for the information on ratios and contacted other centers. Since we were starting fresh and new, I wanted to make sure I stayed in compliance with the state. Our funds are very low since we do not have a full house. A big, huge help were the donations of needed school supplies to get us started. Again, I want to thank everyone who helped donate items to the preschool program to get us started.

We are extremely happy to meet so many new and familiar faces who are attending preschool this year. State Licensing has kept me on my toes. Sometimes I'm confused. example, the very week were supposed to begin, I let the state know we had two teachers with Covid. For that situation, I sent in our procedure of what to do and worked very hard explaining everything to the teachers and the parents. As soon as the state arrived, she told me to get rid of all the signs and parents are to come into the building to drop off their children and preschool goes on as normal. She mainly wanted to know if a serious situation was to arrive, how would I handle it. This made me a little upset due to having the parents and teachers confused and I apologize.



Preschool Open House will take place on Thursday, October 21st 6:00 pm -7:00 pm. Everyone is invited to attend this event, including the congregation.

Parent's you may bring grandparents, aunts, uncles, friends, and family. This is a great time for everyone to come together and see some of the work the children have completed and for the families and friends to visit classrooms and teachers.

The color for the month is BLUE, the shapes are circle and rectangle, and the children will continue to learn the letters i m, f, s, a, and d. We teach the children the sounds and names of these letters to begin putting silly words together. Once the children are introduced to the next batch of letters, they soon start blending and sounding out words.

Thank you to all the parents in helping reinforce the rules of the preschool. If your child comes home with a behavior report or the teacher lets you know about your child's day with inappropriate behavior, thank you for reinforcing and talking to your child about what happened at preschool. Please help him/her understand the circumstances of inappropriate and appropriate behavior.

Western Day! On Wednesday October 13th, the children may dress in western clothes for Western Day to promote

Austin County Fair. Each child may dress in western jeans, boots, shirts, belts, hats and a bandana. If your child decides to wear spurs, this is fine, except if they are hurting another child, then the spurs will be removed. Let's get out our cowboy hats and boots!

Wear Blue Day! Since we are learning blue for the month, we would like the children to wear something BLUE to preschool on Wednesday, October 20th. Children can wear blue clothes, socks, shoes, hair bows, neckties or whatever you can think of to reinforce blue!



911 Safety 911 Safety! Retired State Trooper Gary Pflughaupt will come to the center on Wednesday, October 13th

at 10:15 am to talk to the children about the importance of safety. He will also talk to the children about the importance of seat belt safety and why car seats are very important.

It is important that children know what to do during an emergency, especially if an adult is not present. Children need to know how to dial 911, and conversely, they need to know that they should NOT dial 911 unless there is an emergency.

Retired Trooper Gary will talk to the children about the person on the other line of the 911 who is called a dispatcher and emergency responder. Depending on the call center, emergency dispatchers must follow certain protocols. Sometimes those involve asking very specific questions, and then giving commands.

He will talk to the children that it's ok to give information to the dispatcher and then follow their directions. It could be lifesaving! It's always important that children don't answer the door for just anyone. First responders will always announce themselves and it's important that they know and understand it is okay to open the door for first responders and begin treating the injured person. These are all very important lessons for all children to learn.



Fire Prevention! The Sealy Fire Department will come to the preschool on Friday, October 8th

10:00 am. They will teach the children to stop, drop and roll in case of a fire. Children will enjoy the morning with the Sealy Fire Department as they learn about Fire Safety, since October is Fire Prevention Month. One of the important things that the firemen will teach the children is not to be afraid of them or hide from them in case they are in the house while burning. Firemen are there to help and rescue them even though their equipment may be scary. The firemen will also teach the children how important an escape route is for the entire family and the importance of smoke detectors. This is an important lesson Please try to have your child here for this important lesson.



<u>Harvest Party!</u> The preschool Harvest Party for the entire preschool will be Wednesday, October 27th 9:30 am-

10:30 am. We would like the children to come dressed as one of Noah Ark's animals. We have in the past had great and unique costumes, such as ladybugs, puppy dogs, sheep, kitty cats, cows, and lots more. There are so many simple ways to dress your child as animals without spending a lot of money.

There will be a sign-up volunteer list for refreshments and games. We need parents to help in supervising the children with games that the preschool provides. I will need help in setting up, tearing down, wiping tables and chairs, sweep and clean the kitchen after the party.

If you can help with games or refreshments, please place your name on the volunteer list. Only parents that sign up to help with the party by supervising activity stations can attend. Whoever signs up first will be able to come and help with the party. We will have more parties throughout the year for you to participate.



Teaching children about the community and the need

for food for the ones who do not have is difficult for preschoolers to understand. The children also

learn ways of cooking on stove or oven. Each year the surrounding churches help the food pantry by donating items to help families in need to furnish a meal for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Help fill the boxes to help the Sealy Christian Food Pantry for their annual Thanksgiving and Christmas Drives to the ones in need. They are asking for your help in collecting for the month of October & November as many regular size canned yams and cranberry sauce.

Sealy Christian Food Pantry Information

The time has come for the Sealy Christian Pantry to have their own facility once again due to outgrowing the facility. Right now, the Food Pantry is using Life Bridge church until they can raise enough funds for their new building. Through a lot of prayers and generous supporters, the Pantry was able to purchase land for the new facility on Old San Felipe Rd in Sealy. The next step is to raise funds for a 5000 square foot warehouse/office facility. Obviously, this is a huge endeavor, and the Pantry has begun a fundraising campaign to work towards this goal----H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Eat). If anyone would like to help with this cause, a table is set up in the gym with a container of green bracelets, as well as a jar to place contributions in. The bracelets are to serve as a reminder to pray for this campaign. We ask that you prayerfully consider doing one of the following:

- Take a bracelet and donate
- Take a bracelet and remember to pray for the hungry and for success for this campaign
- Take a bracelet, pray for the success of this campaign, and donate. All will be greatly appreciated!

To help you understand the magnitude of what the Pantry has been through during the Pandemic, here are some 2020-2021 statistics:

• Prior to the Pandemic, we served 75-100 families each week. Those families received food every other week.

- During March 2020 thru December 2020, the Pantry served 225-250 families every week.
 Those families represented 750-1000 family members each week.
- In 2020, the Pantry distributed approximately 500,000 pounds of food!!
- Thru May of 2021, the Pantry averages 170-225 families each week, representing 700-950 family members being served. This equals to approximately 235,000 pounds of food through May of this year.
- The Pantry is seeing more inconsistent numbers each week (some high and some low) in 2021. The hope is that the Pandemic is slowly improving, and that people are slowly returning to work. If you can help in anyway, spread the news to your family and friends to help with cranberry sauce, yams and or donations towards the new building will help feed the ones in need. I want to thank you in advance.

The total contributions for the year 2021 were \$155,100.13 while the total expenses for the year were \$166,116.22.
