# Not Another "At Least" Statement

One of the worst statements we many times make in life are the two words, "at least". We use this short prepositional phrase to attempt in justifying our wrong actions or someone else's wrongs.

The only justification that takes place with this phrase is that the action merely seems not as bad as it is. Regardless of the situation, even when using an "at least" statement, the wrong is still completely wrong.

I remember the true story of a math teacher. One day she caught her student cheating on a test. It was not a matter of assumption. She actually caught him "red-handed", cheating on a test. Now matters of cheating should be taken seriously and brought to the attention of the principal. On that particular day the principal was out of the office. So the issue was taken upon by the school's superintendent since it was a very small school district. The student was sent to the superintendent's office along with the teacher. The teacher was taken back by the statement made by the superintendent when he said, "At least you know that this student is concerned about his grade since he was caught cheating on a test. At least he was trying!"

The Apostle, St. Paul writes to the Christians at Philippi: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." We cannot and should never say to ourselves or to one who is worried about something or are anxious, "At least I'm/you're concerned and not apathetic!" At least? The Scriptures remind us to put all things into the hands of God and then be thankful. Although that is sometimes hard to do if not what seems impossible to do, we cannot try to justify it by saying, "At least". Thieves try to break into a convenient store at night in order to steal money and some merchandise. Yet when they jokingly tried to open the store's front door they found it unlocked. Apparently, the last worker to leave that night got distracted and left without locking up. The robbers then took advantage of the unusual situation. They robbed the store and as a sarcastic joke, they scribbled on a sticky note and placed it on the door. The note read, "Thanks for staying open for us." The next morning when the owner of the store came in, the police were already on location. The clerk next door called the police and met the owner in the parking lot. He handed the owner the note and then said, "At least they were thankful."

"At least" doesn't make us grateful. Instead, it gives us an excuse. Instead, it only inhibits us from the reality. We are sinners but at least we know it. We also know that because of our sin we are condemned to die eternally. The problem is that the statement, "At least it is for eternity!" doesn't do us any good.

God's love overshadows our stupid, justifying "at least" statements. "At least" will not get us very far in life, physically or spiritually. Truly we are thankful to God for His justification for us in His Son, Jesus. He did not say to us "at least" but he says, "Your sins are forgiven because I took your place on the cross." Our false justification of "at least" is done away. Now we can truly be thankful and say, "Jesus died for me and gives me life."

There being no further reports, Noah Hankins made the motion to accept all reports. Janice Wied seconded the motion. All Council members agreed, and the motion passed.


#### **New Business**
