Struggles in His Resurrected Life!

A man once found a cocoon of a caterpillar that would soon transform into a butterfly. After he observed it day after day, he noticed a small opening appeared. He sat and watched the butterfly for several hours as it struggled to force its body through that tiny little hole. Then it seemed to stop making any progress. It appeared as if it had gotten as far as it could get and that it could not get any farther. So, the man then decided to help the butterfly. He took a pair of scissors and snipped off the remaining bit of cocoon in that small hole. By doing this, the insect easily emerged from the cocoon.

Now the problem was the butterfly had a swollen body and its wings were shriveled up. He continued to watch this butterfly. He expected at any time for the butterfly to spread its beautiful wings and fly away. He thought that at any moment its wings would expand and enlarge to be able to support the insect in flight.

Nothing happened though. In fact, that butterfly spent the rest of its life crawling around with a swollen body and shriveled wings. It never was able to walk well. It never was able to fly either.

What the man thought was being kind to the butterfly by helping him out turned out to be more of a hindrance. The man in his kindness and haste did not understand that the restricting cocoon and the struggle required for the butterfly to get through the small opening were God's way of forcing fluid from its body into its wings. In that way, it would be ready for flight once it achieved freedom from the cocoon.

This is a very good lesson for us to learn in life. Just because something is challenging or difficult doesn't mean that it is good for us. Many times we think because Jesus rose from the dead and now gives His resurrected life to us that life will no longer have any trials, tribulations, or struggles.

Jesus definitely went through a horrendous struggle and trial. He was rejected by His own people. Sentenced to die a horrific death on a cross and because of His crucifixion, God forgives us of our sins. This does not mean that everything will be great in our new resurrected life that He gives to us. We definitely will have struggles in life. May we always pray for God's guidance and strength through those struggles because sometimes they, that is the struggles, are what strengthens our faith in Him and in His resurrected life.
