Jesus is the Point!

It is the last inning. Good news – our team is winning the game by twenty-four runs. Everyone on the team has now played in the game because this is what some would consider a "blow out." We are up to bat but many on the team are saying, "What's the point?". There is no way we could lose because the other team has nothing but defeat. Just then, one of our players hits a booming home run over the centerfield fence. No one cheers because the attitude is still, "What's the point?".

What about that one player on the team who hit the homerun? It might have been his or her first one. Even if it is their sixteenth or twentieth we should still celebrate. After all, that person has contributed to our team's effort.

Sometimes we may have that same attitude toward celebrations in the church. Because it's not my child/grandchild/god-child/niece or nephew/relative or friend. I don't feel the need to celebrate. Confirmation or honoring graduates may seem to us as a "What's the point?" moment in life sometimes. We forget that those individuals are on our team or even better, they are on God's team.

Even pastors and church workers may sometimes get this attitude. It's easy to prepare and preach on Easter Sunday when we know the church will be full. Then come the Sundays after Easter Sunday. The feel is not the same. Statistics show that the Sundays following Christmas and Easter are the lowest attended Sundays in most churches, and it is on these Sundays where a pastor can easily say, "What's the point?".

Our pessimistic question should be changed. Instead of inquiring, "What's the point?" we should be asking, "For whom did Jesus die and rise again?" The answer is simply expressed in the passage we know so well – John 3:16: "For God so loved the <u>world</u>, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

Therefore, if Christ died for all in the world, then all are special in the eyes of God. That means everyone should be special in our eyes as well. That also reminds us how not only those who we worship with are special in God's eyes but other fellow Christians around the world. That also means, those individuals who may even not know Jesus yet.

The answer is clear with Jesus' death and resurrection. It's not, "What's the point?" but Jesus is the point! Come and worship as we celebrate Confirmation Sunday (May 1). So come and celebrate this month as we honor graduates of both high school and college (May 15). And celebrate as those from our pre-school will be graduating (May 22). God's blessings to each one of you whom Christ died for and rose from the grave.
