Normal Yet?

This past month things almost seemed to be back to the way it was before the pandemic

began in March of 2020. That is until I went to Colonial Belle in Sealy. I was instructed at the door that they once again had an outbreak of covid. They did not say exactly how many or who (obviously due to health privacy policy) but they still had an outbreak.

Again, this past month, I discovered a few people had contracted coronavirus or had been exposed to someone who had it, just when things were going almost back to normal. Even our worship service is back to the way it was before. Beginning this past month, we started the practice of "passing the plate" for our offering on Sundays (which was the last change made in worship at Trinity because of the pandemic).

What I'm trying to tell you is for your own safety and health, still be cautious about the whole pandemic. For the most part, it seems that the worst is behind us, but it is still present. Whether we are back to normal or not, the one thing which Trinity has not done for two years is host a Vacation Bible School.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) was held at Trinity on Tuesday through Thursday of June 7, 8, and 9th. Our theme this year was "Jerusalem Marketplace." The Bible stories which the children learned were the following: the story of Jesus entering Jerusalem, Jesus' love for all people, Jesus' death and resurrection which all took place in and around Jerusalem.

Children made dreidels while learning a few Hebrew letters and some history of the game. They weaved and made a small basket. Along with the arts and crafts, they sang and danced. And they got to play a lot of games outside on the playground.

Another part of VBS was a Bible drama where the children were introduced to Mary Magdalene. She helped them experience Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Mary spoke to them about the pain of betrayal and losing a friend. Yet, she also shared joy with them at her Lord's resurrection.

Children also were introduced to synagogue school. At synagogue school they learned the Hebrew alphabet, wore yarmulkes, discovered what a tefillin is (a small box which one wears that holds sacred writings from the Bible), and learned a special blessing in Hebrew.

Although attendance of youth was lower than in times past, they heard about God's love in Jesus for us. We continue to serve our great King Jesus whether it is normal or whether it is not normal.

Faithful Tithers

We always have been faithful tithers in our worship life at church. During the past year,

however, we've had so many unexpected bills, we have had to cut back on how much we can give to the church. I feel very guilty about this. What does the Bible say about our offerings?

I appreciate your Christ-centered heart as well as your desire to give back to the Lord your first fruits. Tithing is, as you say, an offering, and not a contribution to a charitable organization. By reducing the amount of your offering, you have not done anything sinful. The grace in which we live is unaffected by how much we give on Sunday. Feeling financial stress due to unexpected expenses is completely understandable. Your struggle to come to terms in a godly way with your changing circumstances is admirable; it is an example of the challenges of faith that confront each of us.

The concept of tithing (giving 10 percent) was demanded in the Old Testament. This dictum, however, is no longer binding. Giving our offering out of a sense of duty, or as "proof" of faithfulness, will only result in feeling burdened and guilty, if we "fail" to give.

St. Paul encouraged the believers in Corinth to "decide in their heart what to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). It is the love God first showed us in our crucified and risen Savior that frees us to make our offering cheerfully. Our giving is a response to such love, a privilege to help proclaim the news of forgiveness and salvation found in Christ.

Although tithing is a healthy guideline, the percentage of our income we offer is not really the issue. Rather, the issue is what is found in the heart of the giver. Jesus made this point as he observed the widow putting in her offering, which, in comparison with others, was meager, yet elicited His highest praise because of the sheer trust and thanks with which she gave (Luke 21:1-4).

Because all that we own and all that we earn belong to God, we, by our offering, merely give back a portion of that with which He has blessed us. It is faith that grasps this reality, in spite of the temptation to find security in material possessions, as the Scriptures promise: "Whoever trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will thrive like a green leaf (Prov. 11:28).

It's strange how we send jokes in e-mails, and they are forwarded right away, but when we are going to send messages about God, we think about it twice before we share it with others?

It's strange how everyone wants a place in heaven, but they don't want to believe, do, or say anything to get there?

The ladies (and men) that make these get together boxes once а month different churches in



The last few years
Trinity Lutheran
Preschool and all
childcare facilities
have been through
so many changes
from Covid 19. In

May 2020, almost 37% of childcare operations temporarily closed. The number of home-based childcare businesses has declined by about 15% since January 2020. Childcare homes, which currently provide about 5% of available childcare slots in the state, are based in the provider's home and are permitted to care for between three and 12 children.

Throughout 2019 and into the beginning of 2020, about 95% of licensed childcare operations in the state were open and providing care. In May 2020, less than two-thirds were open — about 10,500 operations statewide.

Childcare providers resumed care in subsequent months, but some temporary closures became permanent. As of January, the number of licensed operations has declined by about 8% from May 2020. So, although about 97% of operations are open again, there are fewer licensed childcare providers now than before the pandemic.

Texas has received billions in federal aid for childcare providers since the beginning of the pandemic, starting with \$371 million from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act passed in March 2020.

Since then, the federal government allocated an additional \$1.1 billion to Texas childcare providers through the 2021 Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, which was signed into law in December 2020. About half of that \$1.1 billion has already been sent to 9,456 Texas childcare providers and is set to be fully distributed by this fall, said Angela Woellner, a Texas Workforce Commission spokesperson.

Texas will distribute another \$2.45 billion to childcare providers through the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which went into effect last March. In February, The Workforce Commission approved giving an additional billion dollars of federal money to the state's childcare providers, Woellner said.

To survive with fewer tuition-paying families and expensive new pandemic safety guidelines, 42 percent of childcare providers surveyed by NAEYC in November had taken on personal debt, often on credit cards. Providers say they don't know how long they can hold on.

Trinity Lutheran Preschool received a grant, filled out by our preschool treasurer, which took a lot of her time and effort to make sure Trinity Lutheran Preschool remains open. Before the grant was filled out, we brought it to the President of Church Council, Terry Hankins and Head Elder, Barry Wolf to make sure this was approved and legit.

Preschool has already received the first batch of money consisting of \$53,162.00. This money can only be spent on preschool items such as upgrading all the classrooms to new furniture, playground, office equipment, office supplies, classroom supplies and so much more. Once this money is spent and receipts are turned into Work Source Solutions, then we will receive another batch of money by November.

Right now, the preschool will be purchasing a monitor for the preschool office that go along with the cameras that were purchased a couple of years ago. Another expenditure that Workforce Commission wants us to do is tuition assistance for several families. This is another way the money must be used to give back to families in our community.

Trinity Lutheran Preschool is very blessed to still be around. The teachers and office staff worked very hard not to spend preschool money. The preschool staff and office staff spent money out of their own pockets for supplies. Thank you for all the support and prayers.

The total contributions for the year 2022 were \$96,693.21 while the total expenses for the year were \$109,488.41.
