Is Your Life a Feast or Famine?

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

I have had the privilege and honor to serve our Lord in the pastoral ministry for some time now. As I start my eighth year at Trinity, I am amazed at how blest the people of God are. I also realize more and more how you have blessed me, my family, and our lives.

Now, throughout all the years prior to being with you, I can't really remember many Sundays where a prayer of rain wasn't on the prayer list. I remind you that I served a rural, farming, community outside Vernon, Texas. Most of the people there depended on agriculture for their lives. I still think back and am still amazed at the faith I have seen. In that location, rain at any time was a great, true blessing (even a tenth of an inch of precipitation).

Currently, in our corner of the world in Sealy, the land is very dry. (I hate to tell you that I've seen it much, much, much drier but of course that doesn't help the drought we are experiencing.) The drought in our location is one thing of great importance but the drought in our spiritual lives is of an even greater concern. Simply put, how is your spiritual life? Is it a feast or is it a famine?

Now, that's a hard question to answer because we many times compare our material life with our spiritual life. For instance, if everything is going great, if we have no or little debt, if everyone in our family is healthy, if we are enjoying life; then we might say that our spiritual life is great also. Usually however, it's the exact opposite.

Notice in your life, when are you more likely to come to the Lord in prayer? Isn't it when things are going bad? Isn't it when we are hurting or grieving? Isn't it when we are in despair? It's when we recognize our need for God's guidance in our lives that we understand our spiritual needs. We really should be praying in thanksgiving and praying for others when life seems great, but usually, we don't.

So, as we live our lives, let us always consider God's goodness to us through His Son, Jesus. For He also had highs and lows in life but at all times knew His heavenly Father. He always had a right relationship with Him. And even in His death for us on the cross, He served us by dying in that right relationship. Yet the Father raised Him from the dead which gives us new spiritual life because although we many times don't acknowledge it, our greatest need in life is a Savior from sin and death.

Lutheran Witness Subscription Renewals END SUNDAY, AUGUST 28th.



As of June 30, 2022, the cash balance in the General Fund was \$14,854.59. The Building Fund balance was \$35,997.12 and the Designated Fund balance was \$101,572.25. The Total of All Funds was \$140,052.96. The total contributions for June were \$16,743.00 and total expenses for June were \$22,112.02. The total contributions for the year 2022 were \$113,436.21 while the total expenses for the year were \$131,600.43.

- Trinity also received a \$650.00 donation for Heating/AC.
