Great Is Thy Faithfulness

There are likely as many definitions of the word "faithfulness" as there are people trying to define it.

One must understand and be aware of such a multitude of understandings and usages of this word before we actually use it. Faithfulness, as used especially in the church, like many other words has lost much of its effectiveness because of such a wide range and spectrum of ideas concerning it.

In the church, when we use the word "faithfulness" we should mean to be specific. What we mean then is that we risk our lives on the trustworthiness of God and live accordingly.

Faithfulness means to be filled with faith even when our lives do not measure up to God's expectations. Faithfulness means that we are ready to strike out, to take chances, and to stake all we have on His promises. It is most interesting that the Apostle Paul also used the word, "therefore" along with the idea of faithfulness. That indicates that Paul expects some change in the way people conduct themselves. He expects some improvement in what they have been or some effort to measure up to expectations.

To be faithful, then, does not mean to be filled with some great emotion that does not result in change. To be faithful is to become different. And this difference occurs to us in the waters of Baptism when we are changed. Christ now lives in us with His Spirit.

That means that with Christ living in us, we will be different from those who do not have Jesus in their hearts. We Christians are not permanent citizens of this world. We are called "strangers and foreigners" to the world but "faithful friends" to God.

So how will people know that you and I are faithful to Christ? The Bible tells us: By their fruits you shall know them!"

The hymn writer, Thomas Chisholm once wrote:

Pardon for sin and a peace that endureth,
Thine own dear presence to cheer and to guide;
Strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow,
Blessings all mine, with ten thousand beside.
Great is Thy faithfulness! Great is Thy faithfulness!
Morning by morning new mercies I see;
All I have needed Thy hand hath provided;
Great is Thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me!

The month of September went very well with children and parents. This year our ratios are low just like last year. We are extremely happy to meet so many new

and familiar faces who are attending preschool. We have an amazing God who is in control of everything. We have amazing teachers this year who all make me proud. You see, God is always with us. He sees and knows why our ratios this year are low. There is a lot of work that needs to be done this year!

There will be many changes this year in all the preschool classrooms. The preschool hired a contractor to tear down the old counter/cabinets in the first hallway and replace with new cabinets and add additional cabinets above the new counter/cabinets for more storage. In all five classrooms the carpets will be replaced with linoleum. The walls in all five classrooms will be painted and main mural will remain except for one classroom due to wall damage. The maxi blinds in the classrooms by the gym restrooms will be replaced with shades.

Gun Safety! On Wednesday, October 12th, Retired Trooper Gary Pflughaupt will come to the preschool to talk to the children about Gun Safety. Mr. Gary, as the children call him, knows that a lot of children go hunting with their dads and grandpas and would like to keep the little ones safe. Mr. Gary will also explain to the children the importance of what to do if you find a gun, for example, at a friend's house. What do you do with a gun? Mr. Gary will also talk about how to use play guns and not

to point the guns at others. Let's see what the children can learn during Gun Safety!



Wear Blue Day! Since we are learning blue for the month, we would like the children to wear something BLUE to preschool on Friday, October 21st. Children can wear blue clothes, socks, shoes, hair bows, neckties or whatever you can think of to reinforce blue!



Harvest Party! The preschool Harvest Party for the entire preschool will be Wednesday, October 26th 9:30 am-10:30 am. We would like the children to come dressed as one of Noah Ark's animals. We have in the past had great and unique costumes, such as ladybugs, puppy dogs, sheep, kitty cats, cows, and lots more. There are so many simple ways to dress your child as animals without spending a lot of money.

There will be a sign-up list for refreshments and games. We need parents to help in supervising the children with games that the preschool provides. I will need help in setting up, tearing down, wiping tables and chairs, sweep and clean the kitchen after the party.

If you can help with games or refreshments, please place your name on the sign-up list. Only parents that sign up to help with the party by supervising activity stations can attend. Whoever signs up first will be able to come and help with the party. We will have more parties throughout the year for you to participate.



Carving Pumpkin Day with Ms. Pam Epperly will be Thursday October 27th. The preschoolers will have a blast as Ms. Pam volunteers her time to talk to the children about the outside and the inside of the pumpkins. She will discuss with the children God's way of carving a pumpkin.



Themes for the month of October are Family, Fire, Fall, Leaves, Harvest and Pumpkins. The color for the month is BLUE, the shapes are circle and rectangle, and the children will continue to learn the letters i, m, f, s, a, and d. We teach the children the sounds and names of these letters. Using picture boxes or object boxes help the children to recognize the name and sounds to the first batch of letters to begin putting silly words together. Children will continue learning go-togethers, matching, categorizing etc.



Social Focus for the preschoolers will be following directions. Following directions is one of the most important social skills that children develop. Be it in the classroom, at home with the family or on the sporting field, a child who can listen, understand, and then follow instructions and directions will go a long way.



Chapel Time Children have been learning the First Commandment and this month we are adding the Second Commandment: You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks. They will continue The Lord's prayer. The monthly Bible verse is "God is Love." (1 John 4:8)

- Terry Hankins presented 3 A/C Preventative Maintenance Plans which Casey Picard received from OGH Services Inc. After review of all 3 plans, Patricia Rother made a motion to accept Plan C. Ruth Szymanski seconded, and all Council members approved. The Scheduled Preventative Maintenance Plan C includes 1 operational inspection and 1 annual inspection during the contract period on all covered equipment. This plan will be renewed on a yearly basis.
