United in Christ's Service

The Apostle Paul writes to the church at Corinth, the following words:

Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes,

To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus.... I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. (1 Corinthians 1:1-2 & 10)

Since St. Paul deals with division in the church at Corinth, one could easily today, replace the recipient's location of Paul's letter (Corinth) with the name of many different churches throughout the world, including ours: Trinity Lutheran Church in Sealy, Texas.

This statement may sound judgmental, but a person can get caught up into the area where they are serving. For instance, one who is involved deeply with a service in the church such as the Preschool can be quite defensive of that area of ministry. That is all good until that person gains the attitude of us against the rest of the church.

What I am trying to say is that many of our faithful members may be causing a division in the church while not even knowing they are. For example, when a financial issue comes about between the church and the preschool, we tend to take sides. We forget that the preschool is a great mission and service of our congregation. Instead, we take sides as if it is a matter of, "let the preschool pay for it, after all they use our building," or "it's the church's problem, therefore they should fit the bill."

Please remember, my brothers and sisters in Christ, that as we serve Jesus in this location, we do it with love. We serve always considering what is at risk by our subtle division. We serve, not thinking in terms of us and they but "we in Christ." Let us continue our ministry at Trinity as we have in the past, without any division and with the love of Jesus shining through the words and actions we portray.

St. Paul reminds us that "Christ is not divided." Neither should we ever believe that one ministry of the church is more important than another. Let us continue teaching little children the eternal message of God's love for all people through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, His Son.

The Minutes from the meeting held on December 12, 2022 were presented for review and approval. Noah Hankins made a motion to accept the minutes. Barry Wolf seconded the motion. All Council members approved, and the motion passed.

Old Business:

• Ruth Szymanski said that the ACH Debit system has been set up and can now be used. The Council discussed the use of the system and Kimberly Kornegay made a motion to start accepting automatic debits for offering contributions. David Novosad seconded the motion. All Council members agreed, and the motion passed. Members wishing to set up automatic/direct offering contributions can pick up the ACH Debit form from the church office.

• As of December 31, 2022, the cash balance in the General Fund was \$19,005.08. The Building Fund balance was \$27,320.00 and the Designated Fund balance was

\$78,694.00. The Total of All Funds was \$125,019.08. The total contributions for December were \$24,017.00 and total expenses for December were \$22,558.52. The total contributions for the year 2022 were \$242,488.35 while the total expenses for the year were \$267,581.18.

Janice Wied - Stewardship Chairman

- Contributions for the Audio/Media system are \$9,868.00 to date.
- Annual Contribution Statements are in everyone's mailboxes at the church.

Barry Wolf - Elder Chairman

- After discussion of Lent and Advent suppers and services, a motion was made and seconded to eliminate the evening suppers and services for 2023. The motion passed 7-0. Mid-day services will continue and there will also be an Ash Wednesday service for 2023.
- There was also discussion regarding Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services for 2023. With Christmas Eve being on a Sunday, there was a recommendation to have two Christmas Eve services and no Christmas Day service. Elders decided to survey the congregation during the month of February.
- The Elder Contact List was reviewed and updated for 2023.

The next Council meeting will be held on Monday, February 13th, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. and Patricia Rother will have the devotion.


