



Fall Registration Begins

Fall registration will be a little different for the 2023-2024 school vear.

March registration is open as a first come basis for the preschool families that are in the program as of now, and at the same time registration is open to the community. This is due to low enrollment in the last couple of years. Fall enrollment will be on a first come serve basis.

The difference between preschool families that are already enrolled and the ones that will enroll from the community is the The non-refundable cost of registration. registration Trinity fee for Lutheran Preschool is \$150.00.

For the month of March, fall registration will be at a reduced price for both the families enrolled now and for the community. Once April 1st arrives registration will be at the regular price of \$150.00.

For the community, instead of a nonregistration fee of \$150.00 the cost will be a non-refundable fee of \$125.00. For the ones that are enrolled in the program as of now, the non-refundable registration fee is \$100.00.

Registration packets are ready for you to pick up in the preschool office. If you are planning to have your child attend Trinity, please come by the office and pick up a packet, fill out enrollment forms and return them with the registration fee before Friday, March 31st.
