One day when it needed an oil change and its tires rotated, I ventured into town to get the job done. Thank you for your Tithes and Offerings! Offerings may be dropped off or mailed to 402 Atchison, Sealy, TX 77474. Please use your church offering envelopes requested by Stewardship to ensure that you will be given credit for your contributions.



We are happy to offer an easy way to make your offerings to the Church. We can now set up an automatic draft from your checking account into the Church's checking account. All you need to do is complete a one-time form and the set-up is done through the Church's Internet Banking System. You choose the amount, the frequency of your offering (weekly, monthly, annually, etc.) and it will take place as a recurring transfer until you notify us of any changes, or if you wish to discontinue the transaction. Once your banking information is entered, the form will be filed away in a secure location. No one else will be able to view your information. Your account number is hidden from view in the report that is generated for the Stewardship committee. It really is safer than using a paper check, and since this is set up via ACH (Automated Clearing House) as a consumer transaction, you, as the consumer, have up to 60 days to file a dispute, if necessary.

We have been testing this since January, without any issues. There is no charge to you or to the Church, and you will still continue to receive credit for your offerings for tax purposes. Water Safety with Retired Trooper Gary Pflughaupt! When the weather turns warm, everyone wants to be in or

around the water. Hanging out at the pool or the beach on a hot day is a great way to beat the heat. Between having fun and checking out the lifeguards, most people don't think much about water safety — but they should. For people between the ages of 5 and 24, drowning is the second leading cause of accidental death.

Retired Trooper Gary Pflughaupt will be at the preschool on Wednesday, April 26th at 10:00 am to talk to the children about water safety tips. Splashing, wading, and paddling means a great day in the water. Playing at the beach, at a water park, by a lake, or in a pool can be a real treat on a hot day. The Easter Story for Very Young Children

Easter is a time to celebrate Jesus.

God sent Jesus to earth because He loves us. While He lived on earth, Jesus did many wonderful things. He made sick people well. He showed them how to be kind to each other and love one another. He taught God's truth to everyone He met, and He forgave the bad things people did to Him and each other. But the best thing Jesus ever did was die on the cross to save us from our sins.
