The Season of Seasons



Regardless where you live, there are different seasons. Of course, it depends where you live that dictates the severity of each one. For instance, a

Tithe Offering

A **tithe** is an **offering** of money that is given to support the church.

We are happy to offer an easy way to make your offerings to the Church. We can now set up an automatic draft from your checking account into the Church's checking account. All you need to do is complete a one-time form and the set-up is done through the Church's Internet Banking System. You choose the amount, the frequency of your offering (weekly, monthly, annually, etc.) and it will take place as a recurring transfer until you notify us of any changes, or if you wish to discontinue the transaction. Once your banking information is entered, the form will be filed away in a secure location. No one else will be able to view your information. Your account number is hidden from view in the report that is generated for the Stewardship committee. It really is safer than using a paper check, and since this is set up via ACH (Automated Clearing House) as a consumer transaction, you, as the consumer, have up to 60 days to file a dispute, if necessary.

We have been testing this since January, without any issues. There is no charge to you or to the Church, and you will still continue to receive credit for your offerings for tax purposes. 

and Savior, Jesus Christ. Your heart shows love by your participation! From the bottom of my heart and the teachers, THANK YOU!


