No Room for Being Religious or Even Superstitious

Summertime brings baseball to sports fans across the country along with the players' superstitions.

Mark Teixeira had the superstition of wearing two different socks every game. Matt Garza before every game that he was scheduled to pitch, always went to Popeye's Chicken. Moises Alou is known for urinating on his hands so that they would be "tougher". For night games, Wade Boggs would always take batting practice at 5:17 p.m. on the dot. Turk Wendell was known as one of the most superstitious pitchers. Most pitchers avoid stepping on the foul line when they run on or off the field. Turk would emphatically jump over the foul line by never touching dirt. Pitcher Don Robinson would never let anyone throw the ball to him when he started an inning. Instead, he would not catch it, wait for it to stop moving, then pick it up. Former Houston Astros hitter Craig Biggio would always have his helmet covered with pine tar. Whenever Joe DiMaggio would take his position at center field in the outfield, he always touched second base. An expensive superstition was held by Lenny Dykstra who would buy a new pair of batting gloves every time he got put out.

The list of baseball superstitions goes on and on. Compare that list with somethings we do as Christians. You must fold your hands, bow your head, and close your eyes to pray. One should fast before taking the Lord's Supper. We should always cross ourselves at the mention of the name of the Holy Trinity. The list of religious superstitions also continues on and on. (Although, some of them are beneficial as long as one understands the true nature of Christianity.)

As I have emphasized again and again, the Christian faith is not really a religion. It's not about doing things religiously. Following Jesus is all about one's relationship with Him. Even in the Old Testament worshiping idols was seen to be the same as committing adultery or cheating on God with someone or something else. Jesus teaches the same idea. After all, the reason for Jesus' death and resurrection is all about reforming our relationship with our heavenly Father. With His death and resurrection, God forgives us of our sins and rebuilds our relationship with Him.

So, how do we grow in this relationship? It is quite simple: read Your Bible; pray continually for others, and yourself; attend Adult Bible Class on Sunday mornings; and participate in worship every Sunday. Within these things, God continues to give us His gifts to strengthen our faith and our relationship with Him.



Help Sponsor a Child to Attend Trinity Lutheran Preschool Program for 2023-2024

Sponsoring a child is a personal way to show God's love to a child in our community in need of financial support to attend preschool.

First, before a child is given a half scholarship they must qualify. We ask the families who are applying for the program to show proof of their yearly income tax. This information goes no further than the preschool board to assure the family's privacy.

Second, they must attend the five-day program.

Third, tuition is \$350.00 each month. If you sponsor a child, we are asking for \$175.00 per month from you and the other \$175.00 will be from the family.

Why is it important for a child to attend Trinity Lutheran Preschool?

We help children reach their full potential by laying the groundwork for everything else you do in school and life. This preschool has been known to make children succeed.

We have smaller classes which ensure a child will get personalized instruction and the oneon-one attention that is so important for their development.

We teach Bible stories and morals to give them a head start they need in general life. A child is never too young to hear about creation, about God's love, about Jesus and about the many wonderful stories the Bible holds. Every story helps us to get to know what God is like, what we are like, and the way God wants us to live.

We teach children how to learn from their mistakes. Teachers teach children how to learn from their mistakes by providing lots of space for them to play and explore independently, allowing them the chance to make new discoveries every day and confront new challenges.

Trinity Lutheran Preschool is a great place for parents to connect with other families in the community and our church.

This preschool is one of those rare places where you can feel like part of a community while giving a child an incredible start in life.
