Hebrews 12:1-2 is the basis of our theme:



# THE BLESSING BOX PROJECT VISITOR

On Wednesday, January 10<sup>th</sup> while the Blessing Box Ladies were sewing, stuffing, ironing, and cutting, Dawn Compton from Bellville came for a visit.

Dawn was diagnosed with breast cancer in March of 2018. During her journey, she has had surgeries, chemo, and radiation treatments.

God touched her heart when she was using the mastectomy pillow and showed it to a friend. Dawn came up with the pattern and began making them for a few ladies and now making them across the nation.

Dawn, a breast cancer survivor, has ladies that have come together to help her sew these pillows. The group has grown, and she says Jesus helped her and now she wants to help others. Dawn and her tribe of ladies are sewing away and sending blessing box mastectomy pillow packages to women all over the world. Dawn said, "The Blessing Box Project helps women who need not just mastectomy pillows and drain shirts, but support and encouragement".

She said this would not happen if she did not have the help of Jesus. God placed everyone of the ladies from all different areas in her life to come together to make these mastectomy pillows.

She would not be able to do all this without monetary donations for postage, materials, polyfil, and of course all the ladies.

Since February of 2019, 15,883 blessing boxes have been requested and 14,704 blessing boxes have been shipped costing in postage of \$198,504. Dawn Compton decided that all this is God's doing and He is working through her to help others.

Dawn was presented the 2023 Bellville Lions Citizen of the Year Award. When she walked through the door and entered the gym, she wanted each lady to sign the back of her award. Without these ladies and Jesus, and her having cancer, there would not have been a Blessing Box Project.
